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## For An Act To Be Entitled

10 AN ACT TO ESTABLISH A FEDERAL *OFFENSE* AS GROUNDS  
11 FOR REMOVAL FROM MUNICIPAL OFFICE; AND FOR OTHER

### Subtitle

14 AN ACT TO ESTABLISH A FEDERAL *OFFENSE* AS  
15 GROUNDS FOR REMOVAL FROM MUNICIPAL  
16 OFFICE.  
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20 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:  
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#### Section 1. Removal of municipal officer for federal offense.

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23 (a) Upon petition by any citizen of the municipality or the  
24 prosecuting attorney to the circuit court having jurisdiction, any municipal  
25 officer who pleads guilty or nolo contendere to, or is found guilty of, a  
26 federal offense involving embezzlement of public funds, bribery, forgery, or  
27 other infamous crime, or criminal conduct amounting to a felony, malfeasance,  
28 misfeasance, or nonfeasance in office shall be removed from office.

29 (b) The clerk of the court shall transmit to the Governor and city  
30 clerk of the municipality a certified transcript of the removal judgment of  
31 the court.

32 (c) The vacancy shall be filled as may be prescribed by law at the  
33 time the vacancy occurs.  
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35 SECTION 2. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General  
36 Assembly of the State of Arkansas that there is currently no statute that



1 authorizes the removal of a municipal official who pleads guilty or nolo  
2 contendere to, or is found guilty of, a federal offense. Therefore, an  
3 emergency is declared to exist and this act being immediately necessary for  
4 the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall become  
5 effective on:

6 (1) The date of its approval by the Governor;

7 (2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor, the  
8 expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the bill;  
9 or

10 (3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is overridden,  
11 the date the last house overrides the veto.
