SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 24-12-121 is amended to read as follows: 24-12-121. City clerk - Clerk-treasurer - Elected city attorneys.

8 (a) Any city clerk, or clerk-treasurer, <u>or elected city attorney</u> in a 9 city of the first class who shall have served as city clerk, clerk-treasurer, 10 and city treasurer, <u>or as an elected city attorney</u> for a period of not less 11 than ten (10) years, upon reaching the age of sixty (60), or who shall serve 12 twenty (20) years without regard to age, shall be entitled to retire from 13 office for the remainder of his or her life at the retirement pay provided 14 for in this section.

(b)(1) Any city clerk, city treasurer, <u>elected city attorney</u>, or any person serving as city clerk or clerk-treasurer who shall retire or be succeeded by another city clerk, or clerk-treasurer, or <u>elected city attorney</u> within the provisions of this section shall be paid monthly a sum equal to one-half (1/2) of the monthly salary received by him or her during the last preceding year of his or her service.

21 (2) The retirement pay shall be paid by the city from its 22 general fund account.

(c)(1) Any city clerk, or clerk-treasurer, or elected city attorney in a city of the first class who has served in another capacity with the same city, and that capacity of service also provides for a retirement plan, may apply all years served in that previous capacity toward the accrual of the vesting period provided for in subsection (a) of this section, if approved by the city council.
