Arkansas Code § 24-4-301(a), concerning membership in the 28 Arkansas Public Employees' Retirement System, is amended to read as follows: 29 (a)(1) Except as set forth in this subsection, all state employees, as 30 defined in § 24-4-101(17) and (44), shall become members of the Arkansas Public Employees' Retirement System as a condition of employment. 31 (2)(A)(i)(a) A person who is first elected as a member of the 32 33 General Assembly on or after July 1, 1999, shall have his or her employment 34 covered as a regular state employee member in lieu of coverage under special 35 provisions relating to General Assembly members or to elected officials. 36 (b) However, if the member's only service

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1 under an Arkansas retirement plan is service as a member of the General 2 Assembly, the member must have $\frac{10}{10}$ five (5) or more years of actual service to be eligible for benefits. 3 4 (ii)(a) A person who was first elected as a member 5 of the General Assembly before July 1, 1999, may elect to have his or her 6 employment covered as a regular state employee member in lieu of coverage 7 under special provisions relating to General Assembly members or to elected 8 officials. The member may make the election at any time. 9 (b) However, if the member's only service 10 under an Arkansas retirement plan is service as a member of the General 11 Assembly, then the member must have $\frac{10}{10}$ five (5) or more years of actual 12 service to be eligible for benefits. 13 (B) Any member of the General Assembly who was serving in 14 that capacity at the commencement of the Eighty-fourth General Assembly and 15 who had elected not to participate in the Arkansas Public Employees' 16 Retirement System under the provisions of § 24-4-301(a)(2)(A) prior to its 17 amendment by Acts 2003, No. 1403, may elect to participate and receive current credit in the system. The member is eligible to receive prior service 18 19 credit for the time he or she was first elected to the General Assembly until the date of election to participate provided that: 20 21 The member pays, or causes to be paid, all (i) 22 employer contributions based on the employer's normal cost from the most 23 recent actuarial valuation and the compensation that would have been paid had 24 he or she been a member of the system during that time and regular interest 25 on the employer contributions computed from the date the service was rendered 26 to the date payment is received by the system; 27 The payment shall be made in a lump sum; and (ii) 28 (iii) The member may pay for all prior service, or a 29 portion of the prior service, consisting of one (1) year increments. 30 SECTION 3. Arkansas Code § 24-4-508(a), concerning eligibility for 31 32 benefits in the Arkansas Public Employee's Retirement System, is amended to 33 read as follows: 34 (a) Any member may voluntarily retire upon his or her written 35 application filed with the Board of Trustees of the Arkansas Public 36 Employees' Retirement System setting forth at what time, not less than thirty

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1 (30) days nor more than ninety (90) days subsequent to the execution and 2 filing of the application, that he or she desires to be retired if that 3 member has:

4 (1) Twenty-eight (28) or more years of credited service 5 regardless of age;

6 (2) Attained or attains age sixty (60) and has twenty (20) or 7 more years of actual contributory service; or

8 (3) Attained or attains age sixty-five (65) and has five (5) or 9 more years of actual service, except for a member of the General Assembly who 10 must have ten (10) or more years of actual service if he or she only has 11 service as a member of the General Assembly.

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13 14 SECTION 4. Arkansas Code § 24-4-510 is amended to read as follows: 24-4-510. Eligibility for benefits - Deferred and early annuities.

(a)(1)(A) Any member or former member with sufficient years of actual service to qualify for a vested termination annuity who has not attained his or her normal retirement age may retire with an early annuity provided for in subsection (b) of this section upon his or her written application to the plan setting forth at what time, not less than thirty (30) days nor more than ninety (90) days subsequent to the execution and filing of his or her application, he or she desires to be retired.

(B) The member or former member eligible for a vested termination annuity must have at least five (5) years of actual service and be within ten (10) years of normal retirement age, except for members of the General Assembly who must have at least ten (10) years of actual service and be within ten (10) years of normal retirement age.

27 (2)(A) Upon early retirement, a member shall receive a certain 28 percentage of an annuity for life provided for in § 24-4-601. The percentage 29 shall be one hundred percent (100%) reduced by one-half of one percent (0.5%)30 multiplied by the number of months by which the member's age at early retirement is younger than his or her normal retirement age, using what his 31 32 or her normal retirement age would have been under the provisions of § 24-4-33 508 if he or she had continued covered employment from the time of early 34 retirement.

35 (B)(i) However, if the member or former member has at36 least twenty-five (25) years of actual service but less than twenty-eight

(28) years of actual service and has not reached age sixty-five (65), then upon early retirement the member shall receive a percentage of a life annuity as provided in § 24-4-601. The percentage shall be one hundred percent (100%) reduced by one percent (1%) multiplied by the number of months by which the time of early retirement precedes the earlier of either the completion of twenty-eight (28) years of actual service or the attainment of age sixty-five (65).

8 (ii) If the reduction set forth under this 9 subdivision (a)(2)(B) is greater than the reduction that would have otherwise 10 been imposed except for this subdivision (a)(2)(B), then the lesser reduction 11 shall apply.

12 (3) The early annuity shall be effective the first day of the
13 calendar month next following the later of termination of public employer
14 employment or thirty (30) days after receipt by the Board of Trustees of the
15 Arkansas Public Employees' Retirement System of the written application.

(b)(1) A member who terminates covered employment before attaining his or her normal retirement age for a reason other than death or early retirement or disability retirement shall be entitled to an annuity computed in accordance with the provisions of subdivision (b)(2) of this section as it provides at time of last termination of employment, subject to the member's satisfying all of the following conditions:

22 (A) Except for members of the General Assembly, who must 23 have at least ten (10) years of actual service, the The member has five (5) 24 or more years of total actual service with the Arkansas Public Employees' 25 Retirement System or in combination with reciprocal systems under the 26 provisions of §§ 24-2-401 - 24-2-405, and 24-2-407. In establishing the 27 minimum total credited service, periods of credited service covering the same 28 calendar time shall be counted only once. However, both service in the 29 Arkansas Public Employees' Retirement System as a member of the General 30 Assembly and service in another reciprocal system during the same period of 31 time may be counted to meet the service requirements for benefits from the 32 reciprocal systems, subject to the following: 33 (i) The provisions of § 24-4-521 may not be used to 34 meet the service requirements; and

35 (ii) The benefit payable by a reciprocal system will 36 be based on the credited service in that system and on the final average

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1 compensation under that system; 2 (B) If a member has fewer years of service than the final average compensation requirement in a reciprocal system, then "final average 3 4 compensation" means the monthly average of pay to the member during his or 5 her total years of service in that system; 6 (C) The member lives to his or her annuity starting date; 7 and 8 (D) The member makes written application for retirement in 9 accordance with this section. 10 (2)(A) A contributory member with twenty (20) or more years of 11 actual service who left or leaves the employ of a public employer prior to the member's attainment of age sixty (60) for any reason except his or her 12 retirement or death shall be entitled to an annuity provided for in § 24-4-13 14 601, but only if the member does not withdraw his or her accumulated 15 contributions from the members' deposit account. 16 (B) The member's annuity shall begin the first day of the 17 calendar month next following the month after his or her attainment of age sixty (60) upon written application filed with the Board of Trustees of the 18 19 Arkansas Public Employees' Retirement System setting forth at what time, not less than thirty (30) days nor more than ninety (90) days subsequent to the 20 21 execution and filing of the application, the member desires to be retired. 22 (3)(A) A contributory member who has at least five (5) years but 23 less than twenty (20) years of actual service who leaves the employ of a 24 public employer prior to his or her attainment of age sixty-five (65) for any reason except his or her retirement or death and who does not withdraw his or 25 26 her accumulated contributions from the members' deposit account shall be 27 entitled to an annuity provided for in § 24-4-606. 28 (B) A noncontributory member who has at least five (5) years but less than twenty-eight (28) years of actual service who leaves the 29 30 employ of a public employer prior to the attainment of age sixty-five (65) for any reason except retirement or death shall be entitled to an annuity 31 32 provided for in § 24-4-606. 33 (C) The member's annuity shall begin the first day of the 34 calendar month next following the month of attainment of age sixty-five (65) 35 upon written application filed with the board setting forth at what time, not 36 less than thirty (30) days nor more than ninety (90) days subsequent to the

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execution and filing thereof, the member desired to be retired.

2 (4) The monthly amount of vested termination annuity shall be 3 computed in the same manner as a normal annuity amount provided for in § 24-4 4-601, but it shall be based upon the member's credited service and final 5 average compensation at the time of termination of employment covered by the 6 Arkansas Public Employees' Retirement System.

7 (5) The member shall have the right to elect an option provided 8 for in § 24-4-606.

SECTION 5. Arkansas Code § 24-4-511(a), concerning disability retirement benefits of the Arkansas Public Employees' Retirement System, is amended to read as follows:

13 (a)(1)(A) Except for members of the General Assembly who need at least ten (10) years of actual service, any Any active member with five (5) or more 14 15 years of actual service, including actual service for at least eighteen (18) 16 of the twenty-four (24) calendar months immediately preceding his or her 17 disability, who becomes totally and permanently physically or mentally incapacitated for any suitable job or position as an employee as a result of 18 a personal injury or disease may be retired by the Board of Trustees of the 19 20 Arkansas Public Employees' Retirement System upon written application filed 21 with the board by or on behalf of the member.

(B) This may occur only if after a medical examination of
the member made by or under the direction of a physician or physicians
designated by the board, the physician reports to the board in writing that
the member is physically or mentally totally incapacitated for any suitable
job or position, that the incapacity will probably be permanent, and that the
member should be retired.

(2) Upon filing the proper application and meeting the
requirements stated in this section, the disability annuity shall be
effective the first day of the calendar month next following the later of
either the member's termination of active membership or the onset date of the
qualifying disability.

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34 SECTION 6. Arkansas Code § 24-4-521(b)(4), concerning credited service 35 in the Arkansas Public Employees' Retirement System, is amended to read as 36 follows:

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1 (4)(A) Noncontributory employment as a member of the General 2 Assembly shall be credited at the regular rate for crediting service, except that at least ten (10) five (5) years of actual service shall be required to 3 4 meet the retirement eligibility requirements of §§ 24-4-510, 24-4-511, and 5 24-4-609, and at least five (5) years of actual service shall be required to 6 meet the eligibility requirements of § 24-4-608.

7 (B) A member of the General Assembly who at any time has 8 served at least six (6) months during a two-year term in the General Assembly 9 shall be credited with no more than one (1) year's actual service.

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11 SECTION 7. Arkansas Code § 24-4-710 is amended to read as follows: 12 24-4-710. Contributory credited service for General Assembly members 13 and state constitutional officers dying in office - Surviving spouse 14 benefits.

15 (a) Any member of the General Assembly or a state constitutional 16 officer who dies before completing a term of office to which the person was 17 elected shall continue to accrue credited service in the Arkansas Public Employees' Retirement System during the remainder of the term for which the 18 19 person was elected.

20 The surviving spouse of a member or former member of the General (b) 21 Assembly or of a state constitutional officer or former state constitutional 22 officer who, by virtue of the provisions of this section or any other law, 23 has five (5) years or more of credited service in any capacity in the system, 24 except for a member of the General Assembly who must have had ten (10) or more years of credited service if he or she only has service as a member of 25 26 the General Assembly, shall be entitled upon reaching the required age to a 27 surviving spouse benefit in the amount prescribed by law under the division 28 of the system in which the deceased member was receiving benefits or would 29 have been entitled under this section to receive benefits if the member had 30 lived to retirement age.

(c) Nothing contained in this section is intended to, nor shall 31 32 anything in this section be construed to, permit any member or former member 33 of the General Assembly or any constitutional officer or former 34 constitutional officer or any spouse of the member or officer to earn 35 credited service in any retirement system after the expiration of the term of office to which the member was elected. 36

14	SECTION 9. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the

18	members of the General Assembly must have ten (10) years of actual service		
19	before they are eligible for benefits from the Arkansas Public Employees'		
20	Retirement System; that in order for a more fair and equitable treatment of		
21	all members of the Arkansas Public Employees' Retirement System, members of		
22	the General Assembly should vest after five (5) years of actual service; and		
23	that for the proper administration of this act, its provisions should become		
24	effective at the beginning of the next fiscal year. Therefore, an emergency		
25	is declared to exist and this act being necessary for the preservation of the		
26	public peace, health, and safety shall become effective on July 1, 2005.
