34	SECTION 2. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. I	SECTION 2. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the	
35	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that some school districts are		
36	underperforming in the area of direct service Medicaid billing; that the		

1	revenue derived from payment for Medicaid services provided in the schools	
2	enables school districts to continue to provide such services in an effective	
3	and timely manner; and that this act is immediately necessary because any	
4	delay in the effective date of this act would work irreparable harm on the	
5	proper administration and provision of Medicaid services to Arkansas school	
6	children, thus endangering the learning opportunities for children in need of	
7	such services. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and this act	
8	being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health	
9	and safety shall become effective on:	
10	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;	
11	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,	
12	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the	
13	bill; or	
L 4	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is	
15	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.	
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
