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22 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
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24 SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 17-14-206 is amended to read as follows:
25 17-14-206. Complaints and disciplinary procedures.

26 (a) The Arkansas Appraiser Licensing and Certification Board may upon
27 its own motion or upon written complaint of any person, and after notice and
28 hearing as prescribed by the Arkansas Administrative Procedure Act, § 25-15-
29 201 et seq., suspend or revoke the registration, license, or certification of
30 any registrant, licensee, or certificate holder and issue a fine up to the
31 amount of one thousand dollars (\$1,000) per violation occurrence or take any
32 other appropriate disciplinary action for:

- 33 (1) Violation of any provision of this chapter;
34 (2) Falsifying any application for licensure or certification or
35 otherwise providing any false information to the board;
36 (3)(A) Conviction in any jurisdiction of any misdemeanor



1 involving moral turpitude or of any felony.

2 (B) A plea of nolo contendere or no contest shall be
3 considered a conviction for the purposes of this section;

4 (4) Any actions demonstrating untrustworthiness, incompetence,
5 dishonesty, gross negligence, material misrepresentation, fraud, or unethical
6 conduct in any dealings subject to this chapter or these regulations;

7 (5) Adjudication of insanity;

8 (6) Use of advertising or solicitation which is false,
9 misleading, or is otherwise deemed unprofessional by the board;

10 (7) Employing directly or indirectly any unlicensed person to
11 perform any actions subject to this chapter;

12 (8) Habitual or excessive use of intoxicants or illegal drugs;
13 or

14 (9) Failure to meet continuing education requirements within the
15 proper time period.

16 (b) Except in cases in which a licensee, registrant, or certificate
17 holder has obtained a license by false or fraudulent representation, the
18 board shall not investigate the actions of or conduct any disciplinary
19 hearing regarding any licensee, registrant, or certificate holder unless the
20 complaint is filed or the investigation is initiated within three (3) years
21 from the date of the actions complained of or concerning which an
22 investigation is initiated.

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
