24	(A) Records votes by means of a ballot display provided

27	(B) Process the data by means of a computer program;		
28	(C) Records voting data and ballot images in internal or		
29	external memory components; and		
30	(D) Produces a tabulation of the voting data stored in a		
31	removable memory component and in printed copy; and		
32	(2) "Voter verified paper audit trail" means a contemporaneous		
33	paper record of a ballot printed for the voter to confirm his or her votes		
34	before the voter casts his or her ballot.		
35	(b) The State Board of Election Commissioners or the county board of		
36	election commissioners shall not purchase or procure a direct recording		

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1	electronic voting machine that does not include a voter verified paper audit

4	after January 1, 2006 shall include a voter verified paper audit trail,

28	same manner and for the same time period as ballots and certificates are		
29	preserved under § 7-5-702.
