Upon determination by the Board of Corrections 12 that a reallocation of resources within the Department of Community 13 14 Correction and Department of Correction is necessary for the efficient and 15 effective operation of the departments, the Board, with approval of the 16 Governor and approval by the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget 17 Committee, shall have the authority to instruct the department directors, to 18 request from the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State, a transfer of positions, 19 programs, funds and appropriations, and line-item appropriations within or 20 between existing and newly created divisions, offices, sections, or units 21 programs of the departments. If it is determined that the requested transfer 22 should be made, the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State shall then initiate the 23 necessary transfer documents to reflect the transfers upon the fiscal records 24 of the State Treasurer, the State Auditor, the Chief Fiscal Officer of the 25 State, and the Departments of Correction and Community Correction. Provided, 26 however, that the Board shall be limited to submitting no more than 27 Four requests during any fiscal year. 6 Determining the maximum number of employees and the maximum amount of 7 appropriation and general revenue funding for a state agency each fiscal year 8 is the prerogative of the General Assembly. This is usually accomplished by 9 delineating such maximums in the appropriation act(s) for a state agency and 10 the general revenue allocations authorized for each fund and fund account by 11 amendment to the Revenue Stabilization law. Further, the General Assembly 12 has determined that the Department of Correction and the Department of 13 Community Correction may operate more efficiently if some flexibility is 14 provided to the Board of Corrections authorizing broad powers under the 15 Reallocation of Resources provisions herein. Therefore, it is both necessary 16 and appropriate that the General Assembly maintain oversight by requiring 17 prior approval of the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee as 18 provided by this section. The requirement of approval by the Legislative 19 Council or Joint Budget Committee is not a severable part of this section. If the requirement of approval by the Legislative Council or Joint Budget 20 21 Committee is ruled unconstitutional by a court jurisdiction, this entire 22 section is void.

SECTION 20. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 4 5 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. FUND 6 BALANCES - INMATE WELFARE CASH FUND. (A) For all appropriations as provided 7 in this Act, the agency disbursing officer shall monitor the level of fund 8 balances in relation to expenditures on a monthly basis. If any proposed 9 expenditures would cause the Inmate Welfare Cash Fund to decline below seven 10 hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$750,000) , the disbursing officer shall 11 immediately notify the executive head of the agency. Prior to any 12 obligations being made under these circumstances, the agency head shall file written documentation with the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State requesting 13 14 approval of the expenditures. Such documentation shall provide sufficient 15 financial data to justify the expenditures and shall include the following: 16 1) a plan that clearly indicates the specific fiscal impact of such 17 expenditures on the fund balance.

18 2) information clearly indicating and explaining what programs would be cut
19 or any other measures to be taken by the agency to restore the fund balance.
20 3) the extent to which any of the planned expenditures are for one-time costs
21 or one-time purchase of capitalized items.

4) a statement certifying that the expenditure of fund balances will not
jeopardize the financial health of the agency, nor result in a permanent
depletion of the fund balance.

(B) The Chief Fiscal Officer of the State shall review the request and
approve or disapprove all or any part of the request, after having sought
prior review by the Legislative Council.

31 SECTION 21. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 32 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. FUND 33 BALANCES - DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTION FARM FUND. (A) For all appropriations as 34 provided in this Act, the agency disbursing officer shall monitor the level 35 of fund balances in relation to expenditures on a monthly basis. If any 36 proposed expenditures would cause the Department of Correction Farm Fund to

decline below one hundred eight thousand three hundred eighty one dollars
 (\$108,381), the disbursing officer shall immediately notify the executive

head of the agency. Prior to any obligations being made under these
circumstances, the agency head shall file written documentation with the
Chief Fiscal Officer of the State requesting approval of the expenditures.

23 SECTION 22. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS

 25 COST REPORTING - STATE FACILITIES.

26 (a) Within 90 days of the close of each state fiscal year, the Arkansas 27 Department of Correction (ADC) shall submit to the Arkansas Legislative 28 Council a report of all direct and indirect costs incurred by the State of 29 Arkansas in housing and caring for inmates incarcerated in the State's 30 facilities. Such costs shall be calculated and reported in total for the 31 Department and in total by each facility. The report shall also reflect 32 overall cost per inmate per day, cost per inmate per day for each facility, 33 overall cost per bed per day, and cost per bed per day for each facility. 34 (b) In compiling costs and reporting to the Arkansas Legislative Council in 35 accordance with Section 22 (a) of this Act, the Department of Correction 36 shall:

1	(1) Record all expenditures in a manner that provides for the				
2	association of costs with each facility. Costs not directly				
3	attributable to a particular facility (overhead, administration,				
4	treatment, etc.) shall be allocated to each facility on the basis of

(2) Exclude those ADC inmates housed in local governmental facilities and Act 309 prisoners from the number of inmates housed at ADC facilities.

11 SECTION 23. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. LOCAL 12 13 GOVERNMENT INMATE COST REPORT. Within 90 days of the close of each calendar 14 year, each local governmental unit housing inmates sentenced to the Arkansas 15 Department of Correction (ADC) shall submit to the Arkansas Legislative 16 Council a report of all direct and indirect costs incurred by the local 17 governmental unit in housing and caring for such inmates. Guidelines for 18 preparing this cost report shall be developed by ADC in coordination with the 19 Division of Legislative Audit and shall be distributed to the local governmental units within 90 days of the enactment of this law. 20

22 SECTION 24. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. COUNTY 23 24 JAIL REIMBURSEMENT FUND YEAR-END FUND BALANCE CARRYFORWARD. Notwithstanding 25 any law pertaining to the transfer of year-end fund balances or any law to 26 the contrary, any funds which remain in the County Jail Reimbursement Fund at 27 the end of a fiscal year shall remain in the County Jail Reimbursement Fund 28 and made available to fund appropriations authorized by law payable from the 29 County Jail Reimbursement Fund for the following fiscal year.

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31 SECTION 25. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 32 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. COUNTY 33 JAIL REIMBURSEMENT FUND APPROPRIATION CARRYFORWARD. <u>The appropriations</u> 34 provided in this Act for the Inmate Care and Custody Program includes an 35 <u>allocation payable from the County Jail Reimbursement Fund to be used as</u> 36 provided by law. The amount allocated for each year of the FY2005-07

<u>Biennium shall be sufficient to utilize available funding for payments for</u>
 <u>county jail reimbursements.</u> Any unexpended balance of appropriation made
 payable from the County Jail Reimbursement Fund remaining on June 30th each
 fiscal year shall be carried forward and made available for the same purpose
 the following fiscal year.

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7 SECTION 26. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized 8 by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds 9 made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the 10 restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and 11 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary 12 Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by 13 14 the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be 15 strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

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SECTION 27. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly 17 that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained 18 19 in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act 20 was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations 21 and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by 22 the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral 23 testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or 24 Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

26 SECTION 28. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General 27 Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the 28 appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that the 29 effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2005 is essential to the operation of 30 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective 31 date of this Act beyond July 1, 2005 could work irreparable harm upon the 32 33 proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs. 34 Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being 35 necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2005. 36
