9 AN ACT TO MAKE AN APPROPRIATION FOR PERSONAL  
10 SERVICES AND OPERATING EXPENSES FOR SOUTHERN  
11 ARKANSAS UNIVERSITY FOR THE BIENNIAL PERIOD  
12 ENDING JUNE 30, 2007; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

15 AN ACT FOR SOUTHERN ARKANSAS UNIVERSITY  
16 APPROPRIATION FOR THE 2005-2007  
17 BIENNIUM.

21 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:  
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23 SECTION 1. REGULAR SALARIES - OPERATIONS. There is hereby established for  
24 Southern Arkansas University for the 2005-2007 biennium, the following  
25 maximum number of regular employees whose salaries shall be governed by the  
26 provisions of the Uniform Classification and Compensation Act (Arkansas Code  
27 §§21-5-201 et seq.), or its successor, and all laws amendatory thereto.  
28 Provided, however, that any position to which a specific maximum annual  
29 salary is set out herein in dollars, shall be exempt from the provisions of  
30 said Uniform Classification and Compensation Act. All persons occupying  
31 positions authorized herein are hereby governed by the provisions of the  
32 Regular Salaries Procedures and Restrictions Act (Arkansas Code §21-5-101),  
33 or its successor.

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11 SECTION 2. EXTRA HELP - OPERATIONS. There is hereby authorized, for  
 12 Southern Arkansas University for the 2005-2007 biennium, the following  
 13 maximum number of part-time or temporary employees, to be known as "Extra  
 14 Help", payable from funds appropriated herein for such purposes: one  
 15 thousand six hundred (1600) temporary or part-time employees, when needed, at  
 16 rates of pay not to exceed those provided in the Uniform Classification and  
 17 Compensation Act, or its successor, or this act for the appropriate  
 18 classification.

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20 SECTION 3. APPROPRIATION - STATE OPERATIONS. There is hereby appropriated,  
 21 to Southern Arkansas University, to be payable from the Southern Arkansas  
 22 University Fund, for personal services and operating expenses of Southern  
 23 Arkansas University for the biennial period ending June 30, 2007, the  
 24 following:

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5 SECTION 4. APPROPRIATIONS - CASH FUNDS. There is hereby appropriated, to  
6 Southern Arkansas University, to be payable from cash funds as defined by  
7 Arkansas Code 19-4-801 of Southern Arkansas University, for personal services  
8 and operating expenses of Southern Arkansas University for the biennial  
9 period ending June 30, 2007, the following:

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28 SECTION 5. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS  
29 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. FUND  
30 BALANCES. The Board of Trustees in its official governing capacity charged  
31 with the management or control of the institution of higher learning and the  
32 President or Chancellor as the Chief Executive shall certify to the Chief  
33 Fiscal Officer of the State and the Legislative Council that as of December  
34 31 of each year that sufficient appropriations and funds are available, or  
35 will become available, to meet all current and anticipated obligations during  
36 the fiscal year for the payment of the obligations when they become due.

1 This certification, signed by the Chair of the Board of Trustees and the  
 2 President or Chancellor will be forwarded by February 28 of each year or upon  
 3 release of the previous year's audit by Legislative Audit to the Chief Fiscal  
 4 Officer of the State and the Legislative Council accompanied by the Board  
 5 approved published annual financial statement for the preceding fiscal year.

6 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2003  
 7 2005 through June 30, ~~2005~~ 2007.

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9 SECTION 6. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized  
 10 by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds  
 11 made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the  
 12 restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and  
 13 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary  
 14 Procedures and Restrictions Act, the Higher Education Expenditures  
 15 Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal control laws of this  
 16 State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by the Department of  
 17 Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be strictly complied  
 18 with in disbursement of said funds.

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20 SECTION 7. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly  
 21 that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained  
 22 in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act  
 23 was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations  
 24 and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by  
 25 the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral  
 26 testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or  
 27 Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

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29 SECTION 8. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General  
 30 Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the  
 31 appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that the  
 32 effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2005 is essential to the operation of  
 33 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in  
 34 the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective  
 35 date of this Act beyond July 1, 2005 could work irreparable harm upon the  
 36 proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs.



Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being  
necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and  
safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2005.

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
