2	SECTION 2. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the		
3	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that the current statute of		
4	limitations for parking ticket violations is insufficient; that motorists are		
5	ignoring the parking laws of the municipalities in the State of Arkansas; and		
6	that this act is immediately necessary to address problems with parking		
7	safety and use and disrupted parking efficiency and control in municipal		
8	parking districts. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and this act		
9	being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health,		
10	and safety shall become effective on:		
11	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;		
12	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,		
13	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the
