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18	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:	
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20	SECTION 1. Arkansas Code Title 8, Chapter 1 is amended to add an	
21	additional subchapter to read as follows:	
22	8-1-401. Definitions.	
23	For purposes of this subchapter:	
24	(1) "Biobased product" means a product determined by the Unit	<u>ed</u>
25	States Secretary of Agriculture to be a commercial or industrial product,	
26	other than food or feed, that is composed, in whole or in significant part	<u>,</u>
27	of biological products or renewable domestic agricultural materials,	
28	including plant, animal, and marine materials, or forestry materials;	
29	(2)(A) "Biomass" means any organic material that is available	on
30	a renewable or recurring basis.	
31	(B) "Biomass" includes:	
32	(i) Agricultural crops;	
33	(ii) Trees grown for energy production;	
34	(iii) Wood waste and wood residues;	
35	(iv) Plants, including aquatic plants and grasses	<u>;</u>
36	(v) Residues;	

1	<pre>(vi) Fibers;</pre>
2	(vii) Animal wastes and other waste materials; and
3	(viii) Fats, oils, and greases, including recycled
4	fats, oils, and greases.
5	(C) "Biomass" does not include:
6	(i) Paper that is commonly recycled; or
7	(ii) Unsegregated solid waste;
8	(3) "Renewable energy" means energy derived from:
9	(A) A wind, solar, biomass, or geothermal source; or
10	(B) Hydrogen derived from biomass or water using an energy
11	source described in subdivision (3)(A) of this section;
12	(4) "Rural small business" has the meaning that shall be
13	prescribed by the federal regulations pursuant to 7 U.S.C. § 8102 as they
14	existed on January 1, 2005; and
15	(5) "State agency" means any agency, institution, authority,
16	department, board, commission, bureau, council, or other agency of the state
17	supported by appropriation of state or federal funds, including, but not
18	<pre>limited to:</pre>
19	(A) The constitutional departments of the state;
20	(B) The elected constitutional offices of the state;
21	(C) The General Assembly, including, but not limited to:
22	(i) The Legislative Council;
23	(ii) The Legislative Joint Auditing Committee; and
24	(iii) Any supporting agencies and bureaus of the
25	Legislative Council and the Legislative Joint Auditing Committee;
26	(D) The Supreme Court of Arkansas;
27	(E) The Court of Appeals;
28	(F) The circuit courts;
29	(G) The prosecuting attorneys, and
30	(H) The Administrative Office of the Courts.
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32	8-1-402. Procurement of biobased products.
33	(a) After the date specified in the guidelines prepared under
34	subsection (b) of this section, each state agency that procures any items
35	designated in the guidelines shall give preference in making procurement
36	decisions to the items composed of the highest percentage of highesed

1	products that are:
2	(1) Practicable; and
3	(2) Consistent with maintaining a satisfactory level of
4	competition.
5	(b)(1)(A) The Office of State Procurement of the Department of Finance
6	and Administration shall prepare and from time to time revise guidelines for
7	the use of procuring agencies in complying with the requirements of this
8	section.
9	(B) The guidelines shall:
10	(i) Be developed using federal guidelines that
11	designate biobased products that qualify for preferred procurement as
12	authorized by section 9002 of the Farm Security and Rural Investment Act of
13	2002, 7 U.S.C. § 8102, as those federal guidelines and that federal law
14	existed on January 1, 2005;
15	(ii) Provide direct or indirect access to
16	information regarding items identified or certified by federal rules, as they
17	existed on January 1, 2005, that are or can be produced with biobased
18	products and whose procurement by procuring agencies will carry out the
19	objectives of this section;
20	(iii) Set forth recommended practices with respect
21	to the procurement of biobased products and items containing biobased
22	materials; and
23	(iv) Provide direct or indirect access to
24	information on availability, relative price, performance, and environmental
25	and public health benefits of biobased materials and items.
26	(2) The office shall prepare final procurement guidelines under
27	this section within one hundred eighty (180) days based on the federal
28	regulations pursuant to 7 U.S.C. § 8102 as they existed on January 1, 2005.
29	(c)(1) The office shall implement the requirements of this section.
30	(2) Every two (2) years beginning on or before June 30, 2006,
31	the office shall report to the Joint Budget Committee during each regular
32	session of the General Assembly on:
33	(A) Actions taken by state agencies with regard to
34	purchases of biobased products; and
35	(B) Progress made in the implementation of this section,
36	including agency compliance with subsection (b) of this section.

1	(3)(A) Every two (2) years on or before March 31 each state
2	agency shall report to the office on the effectiveness of the agency's
3	procurement program.
4	(B) The office shall prepare and make available to each
5	state agency a procedure for presenting the report required under subdivision
6	(c)(3)(A) of this section.
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
