21 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
22

23 *SECTION 1. REGULAR SALARIES. There is hereby established for the*
24 *Department of Health for the 2005-2007 biennium, the following maximum number*
25 *of regular employees whose salaries shall be governed by the provisions of*
26 *the Uniform Classification and Compensation Act (Arkansas Code §§21-5-201 et*
27 *seq.), or its successor, and all laws amendatory thereto. Provided, however,*
28 *that any position to which a specific maximum annual salary is set out herein*
29 *in dollars, shall be exempt from the provisions of said Uniform*
30 *Classification and Compensation Act. All persons occupying positions*
31 *authorized herein are hereby governed by the provisions of the Regular*
32 *Salaries Procedures and Restrictions Act (Arkansas Code §21-5-101), or its*
33 *successor.*

32 HEALTH UNIT ADMINISTRATORS. Any employee serving in the capacity of County
33 Health Unit Administrator shall be eligible for up to ten percent (10%) of
34 additional compensation within the grade during the period of time in which
35 said employee occupies the position. Employees on the highest level of their
36 grade shall be eligible for additional compensation in an amount not to

1 exceed five and one half percent (5.5%) of their current salary upon assuming
2 responsibility, and this amount shall not be construed as exceeding the line
3 item maximum for the grade for that position. The Health Department shall
4 certify to the Chief Fiscal Officer the assignment of duties of each employee
5 in this position, the length of such assignment, and the location and reason
6 for the assignment. The Chief Fiscal Officer shall approve the request prior
7 to the awarding of additional compensation.

11 SECTION 35. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS

13 OF FUNDS – *HOME HEALTH*. The Disbursing Officer for the Department of Health
14 is hereby authorized to transfer all unexpended funds relative to the *Home*
15 *Health Services* that pertain to reimbursement, as certified by the Chief
16 Fiscal Officer of the State as provided in this Act on June 30, ~~2003~~ 2005, to
17 be carried forward and made available for expenditures for the same purpose

30 are implemented to better provide for the in-home health care needs of the

32 may request the Department of Finance and Administration to approve the
33 establishment of additional positions at salary rates not to exceed the
34 maximum salaries established for comparable positions in the Uniform
35 Classification and Compensation Act. Upon approval of the Legislative
36 Council, the Department of Health - Section of In-Home Services may establish

8 Visit pay shall not exceed \$55 per visit. Employees requested to be on-
9 call and/or on standby for visiting on nights, weekends, and/or holidays will

12 and/or standby who fails to respond after the second notification that their
13 services are needed. In the event of equipment or paging device malfunction,
14 such penalty shall not apply. All compensated services shall be provided as

30 facility, and shall be issued solely for the purpose of defraying the cost of
31 preparing for and participating in actual nuclear disaster incidents or
32 practice nuclear disaster exercises. Each county shall be eligible for that
33 proportion of these funds as is determined fair and necessary under
34 guidelines to be developed by the Department of Health. However, a minimum
35 of \$5,000 per county of said funds shall be utilized to support and operate a
36 County Emergency Management Services Office (~~ESO~~). These county offices shall

1 be prepared to respond to any Arkansas Nuclear I emergency. These funds shall
2 be equally distributed to each Emergency Management Services Office in the
3 following counties: Pope County, Johnson County, Yell County, Conway County
4 and Logan County.

5 The funds appropriated for Grants for Nuclear Planning shall be

25 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. FUND
26 BALANCES - HEATING, VENTILATION, AIR CONDITIONING AND REFRIGERATION FUND OR
27 DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH PLUMBERS LICENSING FUND. (A) For all appropriations as
28 provided in this Act, the agency disbursing officer shall monitor the level
29 of fund balances in relation to expenditures on a monthly basis. If any
30 proposed expenditures would cause the Heating, Ventilation, Air Conditioning
31 and Refrigeration Fund to decline below nine hundred eighty six thousand
32 three hundred thirty dollars (\$986,330) or the Department of Health Plumbers
33 Licensing Fund to decline below one hundred thirty two thousand two hundred
34 and four dollars (\$132,204), the disbursing officer shall immediately notify
35 the executive head of the agency. Prior to any obligations being made under
36 these circumstances, the agency head shall file written documentation with

1 the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State requesting approval of the

31 APPROPRIATION. Upon approval of the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State and

33 Budget Committee, the Department of Health may transfer appropriation from
34 the Contingency Appropriation line item authorized herein for the Home Health
35 Program to any other line item appropriated herein for the Home Health
36 Program.

2 that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained
3 in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act
4 was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations
5 and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by
6 the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral
7 testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or
8 Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

9
10 SECTION 51. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General
11 Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the
12 appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that the
13 effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2005 is essential to the operation of
14 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in
15 the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective
16 date of this Act beyond July 1, 2005 could work irreparable harm upon the
17 proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs.
18 Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being
19 necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and
20 safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2005.
