- 16 (a) For the period July 1, 2005, through June 30, 2006, the State of
  17 Arkansas shall make a monthly payment to each school district in an amount
  18 equal to one hundred fifty-seven dollars (\$157) multiplied by the number of
  19 the district's active participants in the public school employees health
  20 insurance program sponsored by the State and Public School Life and Health
  21 Insurance Board.
  - (b) Beginning July 1, 2006, the State of Arkansas shall make a monthly payment to each school district in an amount equal to one hundred sixty-eight dollars (\$168) multiplied by the number of the district's active participants in the public school employees health insurance program sponsored by the State and Public School Life and Health Insurance Board.

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SECTION 3. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the 28 29 General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that the cost of insurance coverage 30 can be an impediment to teachers pursuing a career in the public school 31 system; that the state needs to provide better insurance benefits to better 32 recruit and maintain quality teachers; and that this act will assist the 33 state in providing a more quality education by increasing its ability to recruit and maintain quality teachers. Therefore, an emergency is declared 34 35 to exist and this act being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall become effective on: 36

1	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;
2	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,
3	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the
4	bill; or
5	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is
6	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
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
