(c) The inspections, while random, shall be performed at least two (2) times one (1) time per calendar year with specific follow-up inspections by the Department of Health to monitor deficiencies and corrections as determined by the Department of Health. (d) The Department of Human Services shall adopt the current Standards for Juvenile Training Schools standards as in effect on January 1, 2005, published by the American Correction Correctional Association in cooperation with the Commission on Accreditation for Corrections as it relates to health concerns.
