2	SECTION 6. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the
3	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that the Arkansas Commission on Eye
4	and Vision Care of School Age Children expires at the end of the current
5	state fiscal year; that the commission is called upon to undertake new
6	responsibilities with regard to eye and vision screenings for school age
7	children that cannot be completed within that time frame; that this act is
8	immediately necessary because any delay in the effective date of this act
9	$\underline{\text{would}}$ work irreparable harm on the ability of the commission to carry out its
10	responsibilities that are designed to benefit Arkansas school children and
11	enhance their learning opportunities. Therefore, an emergency is declared to
12	exist and this act being immediately necessary for the preservation of the
13	public peace, health, and safety shall become effective on:
14	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;
15	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,
16	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the
17	bill; or
18	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is
19	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
