an act to create a child labor law exemption to ALLOW YOUTH TO PARTICIPATE AS SPORTS REFEREES IN CERTAIN SPORTS; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

## Subtitle

AN ACT TO CREATE A CHILD LABOR LAW
EXEMPTION TO ALLOW YOUTH TO PARTICIPATE
AS SPORTS REFEREES IN CERTAIN SPORTS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

SECTION 1. Arkansas Code Title 1l, Chapter 6, is amended to add an additional section to read as follows:

11-6-116. Sports officiating permitted in certain sports.
(a) As used in this section, "employed as a sports official" means employed as an official, referee, or umpire in organized youth football, baseball, softball, basketball, or soccer leagues.
(b) Except as provided in this section, the provisions of this chapter relating to child labor shall not apply to a minor at least eleven (ll) years of age employed as a sports official for an age bracket younger than the minor's own age if:
(l) An adult representing the state or local athletic program is on the premises at which the athletic program event is occurring; and
(2) A person responsible for the state or local athletic program possesses a written acknowledgment signed by the minor's parent or guardian consenting to the minor's employment as a sports official.







(c) The provisions of $\S \S 11-6-108$ and 11-6-110, relating to hours of employment, shall apply to any minor employed under this section.
