## For An Act To Be Entitled

AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE THE OPERATION ENDURING FREEDOM VETERAN LICENSE PLATE; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
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SECTION 1. Arkansas Code Title 27, Chapter 15 is amended to add an additional subchapter to read as follows:

Subchapter 48.
Operation Enduring Freedom Veteran License Plate.
27-15-4801. Operation Enduring Freedom Veteran license plate authorized.

The Director of the Department of Finance and Administration shall issue a special Operation Enduring Freedom Veteran motor vehicle license plate in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in this subchapter.

27-15-4802. Design.
(a) The license plates issued under this subchapter shall be the standard color and design as are currently issued by the Department of Finance and Administration, except that in lieu of the legend "The Natural State" or any succeeding legend, the license plates shall have placed across
the bottom a permanent decal bearing the words "Operation Enduring Freedom Veteran".
(b) The license plates issued under this subchapter shall be numbered consecutively.

27-15-4803. Eligibility.
(a) The Department of Finance and Administration shall require proof of eligibility for a special license plate under this subchapter.
(b) The proof shall be sufficient to establish that the applicant honorably served in Operation Enduring Freedom.

27-15-4804.
(a) Upon payment of the fee required by law for the registration of the vehicle and payment of an additional handling and administrative fee of ten dollars (\$10.00) for the issuance of the special Operation Enduring Freedom Veteran license plate, the Department of Finance and Administration shall issue to the vehicle owner an Operation Enduring Freedom Veteran license plate.
(b) (l) The handling and administrative fee of ten dollars (\$10.00) shall be deposited to the State Central Services Fund for the benefit of the Revenue Division of the Department of Finance and Administration.
(2) The fee shall not be considered or credited to the division as direct revenues.

27-15-4805. Renewal.
(a) (1) The special Operation Enduring Freedom Veteran license plate issued under this subchapter may be renewed annually under the procedures in § 27-15-4803 and under §§ 27-14-1012 and 27-14-1013.
(2) Registration may continue from year to year as long as it is renewed each year within the time and manner required by law.
(b) Upon expiration or if the special Operation Enduring Freedom Veteran license plate is lost, the plate may be replaced with a regular license plate at the fee specified in § 27-14-602(b)(6).
(c) If the special Operation Enduring Freedom Veteran license plate is replaced with a new Operation Enduring Freedom Veteran license plate, the owner shall be required to pay the fees for the issuance of the license plate
under § 27-15-4803.

27-15-4806. Transfer to another vehicle.
The special Operation Enduring Freedom Veteran license plate issued under this subchapter may be transferred from one (l) vehicle to another as provided in § 27-14-914.

27-15-4807. Compliance with other laws -- Exemption from minimum applications and discontinuation.
(a) The special Operation Enduring Freedom Veteran license plate shall comply with all other state motor vehicle laws relating to registration and licensing of motor vehicles unless specifically provided otherwise in this subchapter.
(b) The special Operation Enduring Freedom Veteran license plate is exempt from the minimum application requirements under § 27-15-4004(a) and the discontinuation of the license plate under § 27-15-4004(b).

27-15-4808. Rules and regulations.
The Director of the Department of Finance and Administration shall promulgate reasonable rules and regulations and prescribe forms as the director determines to be necessary for effectively and efficiently carrying out the intent and purposes of this subchapter.

SECTION 2. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that since September 11, 2001, the country has an increased need for soldiers to fight against terrorism abroad; that Reservists and National Guard members risk their lives to protect and defend our country; that military service in Operation Enduring Freedom should be honored; and that this act is immediately necessary to honor the veterans of Operation Enduring Freedom. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and this act being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall become effective on:
(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;
(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor, the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the bill; or
(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
