- 4 permitted waste tire processing facility, at a waste tire collection center,
- 5 or at a permitted solid waste disposal facility.
- 6 (3)(A) Whole tires shall not be deposited in a landfill as a
- 7 method of ultimate disposal unless shredded or split into sufficiently small
- 8 parts to assure their proper disposal.
- 9 (B) Whole tires shall not be disposed of in a landfill
- 10 containing any other type of waste unless the tires are disposed of in a
- 11 separate area of the landfill and the area has been prepared in such a manner
- 12 that the tires can be recovered at a later date. Three (3) years after the
- 13 effective date of this act, only automobile tires that have been processed by
- 14 cutting, shredding, or splitting into sufficiently small parts to assure
- 15 proper disposal, or automobile tires processed by baling, may be disposed at
- 16 <u>a disposal site that has a permit issued for a landfill designed and operated</u>
- 17 <u>as a waste tire monofill.</u>
- 18 (4) A person who leases or owns real property may use waste
- 19 tires for soil erosion abatement and drainage purposes in accordance with
- 20 procedures approved by the Arkansas Pollution Control and Ecology Commission
- 21 and each solid waste management district or to secure covers over silage,
- 22 hay, straw, or agricultural products.
- 23 (d)(1) The commission shall adopt regulations to carry out the
- 24 provisions of this section.

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- (2) The regulations shall:
- 26 (A) Provide for the administration of waste tire
- 27 processing facility permits and for a fee for each permit which shall not
- 28 exceed two hundred fifty dollars (\$250) annually;
- 29 (B) Provide for the administration of waste tire hauler's
- 30 <u>transporter</u> licenses, waste tire collection center permits, and for a fee for
- 31 each permit which shall not exceed two hundred fifty dollars (\$250) annually;
- 32 (C) Set standards for waste tire processing facilities and
- 33 associated waste tire sites, waste tire collection centers, and waste tire
- 34 collectors transporters;
- 35 (D) Establish procedures for administering the waste tire
- 36 grant program and issuing grants; and

1 (E) Authorize the final <u>disposal disposition</u> of waste 2 tires at a permitted solid waste disposal facility, provided the tires have 3 been cut into sufficiently small parts to assure their proper disposal.

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- (e) A waste tire processing facility and/or collection center permit is not required for:
- (1) A tire retreading business where fewer than five hundred (500) one thousand (1,000) waste tires are kept on the business premises;
- 8 (2) A business that in the ordinary course of business removes
 9 tires from motor vehicles if fewer than five hundred (500) one thousand
 10 (1,000) of those tires are kept on the business premises; or
- 11 (3) A retail tire-selling business which is serving as a waste 12 tire collection center if fewer than five hundred (500) one thousand (1,000) 13 waste tires are kept on the business premises; or
 - (4) A site designated by a regional solid waste management district, serving as a waste tire collection center, where fewer than one thousand (1,000) tires are kept on the premises.
 - (f) The commission and each solid waste management district shall encourage the voluntary establishment of waste tire collection centers at retail tire-selling businesses, waste tire processing facilities, and solid waste disposal facilities, for the deposit of used and waste tires generated in the State of Arkansas, except those generated by a tire manufacturer.
 - (g)(1) Waste tires originating from a tire manufacturer shall be disposed of at either a permitted waste tire collection center or a permitted waste tire processing facility for a fee to be established by either of those facilities if disposed of in the State of Arkansas.
 - (2) Records of the disposition of the waste tires originating from a tire manufacturer shall be maintained by that manufacturer for a period of at least three (3) years and shall be available for review by the department.
- 30 (h) The commission shall establish guidelines and adopt regulations 31 for a tire manifest system to monitor the sale and distribution of tires 32 between tire dealers, waste tire collectors, waste tire processing 33 facilities, and waste tire disposal facilities.
 - (i) Notwithstanding subsection (e) of this section, a retail tireselling business which is serving as a waste tire collection center may keep up to one thousand (1,000) waste tires on the business premises without

1	obtaining a permit until a waste tire collection center becomes operational		
2	in the regional solid waste management district where the business premises		
3	are located.		
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
