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- 25 SECTION 9. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is hereby found and determined by the
- 26 General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that changes in the state's fiscal
- 27 laws must take effect at the beginning of the fiscal year, that if the
- 28 current legislative session is extended such that the 90 day period is later
- 29 than July 1, 2005 the changes will not be timely. Therefore, an emergency is
- 30 declared to exist and this act being immediately necessary for the
- 31 preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall become effective
- 32 on July 1, 2005.

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
