26	6-16-1202. Def	initions.	
27	As used in this	subchapter:	
28	(1) "Adv	ranced placement course" means a high	school level

5	(3) "Pre-advanced placement course" means a middle school,
6	junior high school, or high school level course that specifically prepares
7	students to enroll and to participate in an advanced course; and
8	(4) "Vertical team" means a group of educators from different
9	grade levels in a given discipline who work cooperatively to develop and
10	implement a vertically aligned program aimed at helping students from diverse
11	backgrounds acquire the academic skills necessary for success in the advanced
12	placement program and other challenging coursework.
13	
14	6-16-1203. Teacher skills and training.
15	(a)(1) A teacher of an advanced placement course must obtain
16	appropriate training.
17	$\frac{(b)(1)}{(2)}$ The State Board of Education shall establish clear,
18	specific, and challenging training guidelines that require teachers of
19	College Board advanced placement courses and teachers of pre-advanced
20	placement courses to obtain College Board sponsored or endorsed training.
21	$\frac{(2)}{(3)}$ The training may include vertical team training.
22	(b) An instructor of an endorsed concurrent enrollment course shall
23	have:
24	(1) No less than a master's degree that includes at least
25	eighteen (18) hours of completed course work in a subject matter related to
26	the endorsed concurrent enrollment course, and such credentials shall be
27	approved by the academic unit or chief academic officer of the college; and
28	(2) Advanced skills as necessary to teach from the same syllabus
29	as is used at the college level.
30	
31	6-16-1204. Implementation of advanced placement courses.
32	(a) In order to prepare students for the rigor inherent in advanced
33	placement courses, school districts shall offer pre-advanced placement
34	courses to prepare students for the demands of advanced placement coursework.
35	(b)(1) The Department of Education shall:
36	(1)(A) Approve all classes designated as pre-advanced

1	placement courses; and
2	(2) Develop rules necessary for the implementation of
3	advanced placement courses.
4	(2) To qualify as an endorsed concurrent enrollment course under
5	this section, the course:
6	(A)(i) Shall be taught from substantially the same book
7	and syllabus as is used at the college level; and
8	(ii) Shall be taught by a instructor with the
9	qualifications set forth under § 6-16-1203(b); or
10	(B) Is approved for weighted credit under § 6-15-902(c).
11	(3) An endorsed concurrent enrollment course that is not already
12	approved for weighted credit may qualify for weighted credit as provided
13	under § 6-15-902(c).
14	(c) Beginning with the 2008-2009 school year, all school districts
15	shall offer one (1) College Board advanced placement course or endorsed
16	concurrent enrollment course in each of the four (4) core areas of math,
17	English, science, and social studies for a total of four (4) courses.
18	(d)(1) The requirement under subsection (c) of this section shall be
19	phased in over a period of four (4) years beginning with the 2005-2006 school
20	year.
21	(2) Beginning with the 2008-2009 school year, all high schools
22	in Arkansas shall offer a minimum of four (4) advanced placement courses $\underline{\text{or}}$
23	endorsed concurrent enrollment courses by adding at least one (1) core course
24	each year to the list of courses available to high school students.
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26	SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 6-16-1205 is repealed.
27	6-16-1205. Concurrent Enrollment Course Approval Panel.
28	(a) There is established a panel to be known as the "Goncurrent
29	Enrollment Course Approval Panel".
30	(b) The panel shall consist of six (6) members as follows:
31	(1) Three (3) persons appointed by the Director of the
32	Department of Education; and
33	(2) Three (3) persons appointed by the Director of the
34	Department of Higher Education.
35	(c) The appointed panel members shall be:
36	(1) Knowledgeable regarding advanced placement coursework or

2	(2) Residents of the State of Arkansas at the time of
3	appointment and throughout their terms.
4	(d) Members shall serve at the pleasure of the director making his or
5	her appointment.
6	(e) If a vacancy occurs in an appointed position for any reason, the
7	vacancy shall be filled by appointment by the director of the department who
8	made the original appointment.
9	(f)(1) Panel members appointed by the Director of the Department of
10	Education and the Director of the Department of Higher Education shall
11	alternate serving as chair of the panel each year.
12	(2) The Director of the Department of Education and the Director
13	of the Department of Higher Education shall alternate each year naming a
14	person to serve as chair of the panel.
15	(3) The Director of the Department of Education and the Director
16	of the Department of Higher Education shall draw lots to determine which
17	director shall first appoint a chair.
18	(g)(1) The panel shall meet at times and places the chair deems
19	necessary, but no meetings shall be held outside of the State of Arkansas.
20	(2) A majority of the members of the panel shall constitute a
21	quorum for the purpose of transacting business.
22	(3) All action of the panel shall be by a majority vote of the
23	full membership of the panel.
24	(h) For the purposes of access and equity, the panel shall make
25	recommendations to the Department of Education and the Department of Higher
26	Education regarding the rules for offering of advanced placement courses or
27	concurrent enrollment courses, or both.
28	(i) The Department of Higher Education and the Department of Education
29	may jointly promulgate rules for offering of advanced placement courses or
30	concurrent enrollment courses, or both, based upon the recommendations of the
31	panel.
32	(j)(1) The Department of Higher Education shall provide staff and
33	office space to the panel.
34	$(2)(\Lambda)$ Members of the panel shall serve without pay.
35	(B) Members of the panel may receive expense reimbursement
36	in accordance with § 25-16-902, to be paid by the Department of Higher

1	Education to the extent that money is available.
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3	SECTION 3. Arkansas Code Title 6, Chapter 16, Subchapter 12 is amended
4	to add an additional section to read as follows:
5	6-16-1207. Limitations.
6	Nothing in this subchapter shall limit or define concurrent enrollment
7	courses offered for elective credit or upon agreement between a school or
8	school district and a college if the courses are not required under this
9	subchapter for any of the four (4) core areas of math, English, science, or
10	social studies.
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12	SECTION 4. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the
13	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that many high school students
14	benefit from participating in concurrent enrollment course; that this act is
15	necessary to ensure that students continue to have the opportunity to enroll
16	in concurrent enrollment classes; and that this act is immediately necessary
17	to allow school districts sufficient time to plan schedules and hire staff
18	prior to the 2005-2006 school year. Therefore, an emergency is declared to
19	exist and this act being immediately necessary for the preservation of the
20	public peace, health, and safety shall become effective on:
21	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;
22	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,
23	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the
24	bill; or
25	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is
26	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
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
