32	(b) The Professional Licensure Standards Board shall consist of
33	fifteen (15) members as follows:
34	(1) Twelve (12) members appointed by the State Board of
35	Education as follows:
36	(A) Three (3) public school teachers with an Arkansas

15	teaching license selected from a list of no fewer than three (3) different	
16	administrators submitted by the Arkansas Association of Secondary Principals;	
17	(F) One (1) public school administrator with an Arkansas	
18	teaching license selected from a list of no fewer than three (3) different	
19	administrators submitted by the Arkansas Association of Elementary	
20	Principals;	
21	(G) One (1) dean of a public institution of higher	
22	education school of education, college of education, or department of	
23	education from a list of no fewer than three (3) different administrators	
24	submitted by the Executive Council of the Arkansas Higher Education	
25	Coordinating Board; and	
26	(H) Three (3) representatives of an independent	
27	institution of higher education from a list of no fewer than eight	
28	(8) different representatives submitted by the Association of Colleges for	
29	Teacher Education;	
30	(2) The Coordinator for Professional Quality Enhancement	
31	Division of the Department of Education in a non voting, ex officio capacity;	
32	(3) The Coordinator for Professional Licensure Division of the	
33	Department of Education in a non voting, ex officio capacity; and	
34	(4) The Non-traditional Licensure Program Advisor of the	
35	Department of Education in a non voting, ex officio capacity.	
36	(c) Any list to be submitted under subsection (b) of this section	

1	shall be submitted to the secretary of the State Board of Education by June
2	30, 2005. If a list for the respective position is not submitted by the
3	deadline, the State Board of Education may appoint any qualified person to
4	fill the position.
5	(d) The appointed Professional Licensure Standards Board professional
6	licensure Professional Licensure Standards Board members shall be residents
7	of the State of Arkansas at the time of appointment and throughout their
8	terms.
9	(1) The Director of the Department of Education shall call an
10	organizational meeting within twenty (20) calendar days after the State Board
11	of Education has made all necessary appointments.
12	(2) The Director of the Department of Education shall serve as
13	chair at the organizational meeting until the Professional Licensure
14	Standards Board elects a chair from among its members during the first
15	organizational meeting.
16	(f)(1) The Professional Licensure Standards Board shall meet at times
17	and places the chair deems necessary, but no meetings shall be held outside
18	of the State of Arkansas.
19	(2) A majority of the members of the Professional Licensure
20	Standards Board shall constitute a quorum for the purpose of transacting
21	business.
22	(3) All action of the Professional Licensure Standards Board
23	shall be by a majority vote of the full membership of the Professional
24	Licensure Standards Board.
25	(g) The Professional Licensure Standards Board shall:
26	(1) Develop and recommend for adoption to the State Board of
27	Education uniform college level preparatory and grade point average
28	requirements for all teachers applying for initial licensure or relicensure
29	after July 1, 2006, that shall include uniform and specific requirements for:
30	(A) Course of study;
31	(B) College level teacher education classes;
32	(C) Subject-matter specific course work certification or
33	licensure in a particular subject area rather than grade-level certification;
34	<u>and</u>
35	(D) In-class teaching internships or practice teaching
36	hours.

I	(2) With the assistance of the Department of Education and the
2	Department of Higher Education, review the teacher education programs offered
3	by all institutions' of higher education in the state to determine if the
4	institutions teacher education programs and courses of study are aligned as
5	necessary to allow graduates of the teacher education program to become
6	licensed under this act and the rules set by the State Board of Education.
7	(h)(1) The Department of Education shall provide staff and office
8	space to the Professional Licensure Standards Board.
9	(2)(A) Members of the Professional Licensure Standards Board
10	shall serve without pay.
11	(B) Members of the Professional Licensure Standards Board
12	may receive expense reimbursement in accordance with § 25-16-902, to be paid
13	by the Department of Education to the extent money is available for that
14	purpose.
15	
16	SECTION 4. No institution of higher learning education shall be an
17	eligible institution for purposes of the Arkansas Academic Challenge
18	Scholarship Program or the State Teacher Assistance Resource Program, or
19	shall use any state funds to pay the salaries of instructors in its teacher
20	education programs unless the institution has aligned its teacher education
21	programs and courses of study as necessary for a graduate to become eligible
22	for a license under this act and the rules set by the State Board of
23	Education.
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
