(f)(1) The division shall have the authority to collect from the individual board utilizing the services delineated herein in this section up to thirty-five dollars (\$35.00) fifty dollars (\$50.00) per hour with a maximum of two thousand dollars (\$2,000) in hourly costs per case. SECTION 3. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that the Division of Pharmacy Services and Drug Control of the Department of Health investigates licensure complaints for seven (7) professional licensing boards; that the Division of Pharmacy Services and Drug Control has a backlog of about sixty (60) open cases; that the professional work of licensees may be seriously compromised so long as the investigation remains uncompleted; and that the proposed fee increase would enable the hiring of an additional investigator to aid in completion of cases in a timely manner. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and this act being necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall become effective on July 1, 2005.
