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24 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
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26 SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 17-80-106(h)(1), concerning allowable
27 reimbursements of Department of Health investigations and inspections of
28 alleged wrongdoing of medical professionals, is amended to read as follows:

29 (h)(1) The division shall have the authority to collect from the
30 individual board utilizing the services delineated in this section up to
31 ~~thirty five dollars (\$35.00)~~ fifty dollars (\$50.00) per hour ~~with a maximum~~
32 ~~of four thousand dollars (\$4,000) in hourly costs per case.~~

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34 SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 17-95-304(f)(1), concerning allowable
35 reimbursements of Department of Health investigations and inspections of
36 persons licensed under the Arkansas State Medical Board, is amended to read



1 as follows:

2 (f)(1) The division shall have the authority to collect from the
3 individual board utilizing the services delineated ~~herein~~ in this section up
4 to ~~thirty five dollars (\$35.00)~~ fifty dollars (\$50.00) per hour with a
5 ~~maximum of two thousand dollars (\$2,000) in hourly costs per case.~~

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7 SECTION 3. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the
8 General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that the Division of Pharmacy
9 Services and Drug Control of the Department of Health investigates licensure
10 complaints for seven (7) professional licensing boards; that the Division of
11 Pharmacy Services and Drug Control has a backlog of about sixty (60) open
12 cases; that the professional work of licensees may be seriously compromised
13 so long as the investigation remains uncompleted; and that the proposed fee
14 increase would enable the hiring of an additional investigator to aid in
15 completion of cases in a timely manner. Therefore, an emergency is declared
16 to exist and this act being necessary for the preservation of the public
17 peace, health, and safety shall become effective on July 1, 2005.

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
