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27	SECTION 1. Arkansas C	ode § 20-23-101 is amende	ed to read as follows:

30	(l) "Boiler" , <u>or</u> "boi	lers" , or "steam boilers'	<u>"</u> means any boiler or
31	like vessel or container in	which water is heated or	steam is generated by
32	the application of heat and	shall mean any unfired pa	ressure vessels
33	constructed for the accumula	tion, storage, or transp o	ortation of air, liquids,
34	or gases that are under indu	eed pressure; and include	es:
35	(A) Steam boile	rs that generate steam ur	nder pressure and
36	<u>includes:</u>		

1	(i) High pressure steam boilers that generate steam under			
2	pressure above fifteen pounds per square inch gauge (15 psig); and			
3	(ii) Low pressure steam heating boilers that generate			
4	steam at fifteen pounds per square inch gauge (15 psig) or less for heating			
5	purposes;			
6	(B) Hot water heating boilers that heat water for the external			
7	use of heating any area or building; and			
8	(C) Hot water heaters that are used for heating water for			
9	external use for domestic purposes;			
10	(2) "Horsepower" means the evaporation of thirty-four and one-half			
11	pounds (341/2 lbs.) of water from a temperature of two hundred twelve degrees			
12	Fahrenheit (212° F) into steam at two hundred twelve degrees Fahrenheit (212°			
13	F) at fourteen and seven-tenths pounds per square inch absolute (14.7 psia);			
14	(3) "Internal" and "external" inspection means a thorough and proper			
15	inspection as provided for in the rules and regulations by the Boiler			
16	Advisory Board;			
17	(4)(A) "Pressure piping" means power piping systems and their			
18	component parts within or forming a part of the pressure piping system			
19	connected to any boiler or unfired pressure vessel covered by the provisions			
20	of this chapter.			
21	(B) This includes only boiler external piping for power boilers			
22	and high temperature, high pressure water boilers in which:			
23	(i) Steam or vapor is generated at a pressure of more than			
24	fifteen pounds per square inch gauge pressure (15 psig); and			
25	(ii) High temperature water is generated at pressures			
26	exceeding one hundred sixty pounds per square inch gauge pressure (160 psig)			
27	and/or temperatures exceeding two hundred fifty degrees Fahrenheit (250° F) or			
28	one hundred twenty degrees Centigrade (120°C).			
29	(C) Boiler external piping shall be considered as that piping			
30	which begins where the boiler proper terminates at:			
31	(i) The first circumferential joint for welding end			
32	connections;			
33	(ii) The face of the first flange in bolted flanged			
34	connections; or			
35	(iii) The first threaded joint in that type of connection			
36	and which extends up to and including the valve or valves required by			

- 1 regulation; 2 (5) "Pressure vessel" means any unfired pressure vessel constructed 3 for the accumulation, storage, or transportation of air, liquids, or gases 4 that are under induced pressure; and 5 (6) "PSIG" means pounds per square inch gauge pressure. 6 7 SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 20-23-202 is amended to read as follows: 8 20-23-202. Chief inspector, deputy inspector, etc. 9 (a)(1) When the office of chief inspector becomes vacant, the Director 10 of the Department of Labor shall appoint and may remove for cause when so 11 appointed employ a citizen of the State of Arkansas to be Chief Inspector of 12 the Boiler Inspection Division. 13 The chief inspector must be a qualified boilermaker who has 14 had have at the time of the appointment employment not less than ten (10) 15 years' experience in the construction, maintenance, installation, and repair 16 or inspection of high pressure boilers and unfired pressure vessels, of which 17 at least three (3) years has been in the inspection of boilers. (b)(1) The chief inspector Director of the Department of Labor is 18 19 authorized and empowered to employ a technical assistant and deputy 20 inspectors of boilers. 21 (A) They Inspectors of steam boilers and unfired pressure 22 vessels shall have had at the time of employment not less than five (5) 23 years' experience in the construction, maintenance, installation, and repair 24 of high pressure boilers and unfired pressure vessels or possess a currently valid commission from the National Board of Boiler and Pressure Vessel 25 26 Inspectors. 27 (B)(i) They Inspectors of steam boilers and unfired 28 pressure vessels also shall have passed a written examination. 29 (ii) The examination shall conform to standards not 30 exceeding those prescribed by the Boiler Code of the American Society of 31 Mechanical Engineers.
- 32 <u>(iii) It The examination</u> shall test their the
 33 <u>inspector's</u> knowledge of the construction, installation, maintenance, and
 34 repair of boilers and their appurtenances.
- 35 (C) The number of deputies shall be determined by the 36 income and work necessary to be performed by the division.

1	(2) The chief inspector <u>Director of the Department of Labor</u> is		
2	also empowered to employ a secretary, chief clerk, bookkeeper, and		
3	stenographers clerical and administrative employees, as well as other		
4	$\underline{\text{inspectors,}}$ as necessary to perform the $\underline{\text{office}}$ work of the Boiler Inspection		
5	Division.		
6	(3) The salaries are to be approved by the General Assembly.		
7	(c)(1) The chief inspector shall furnish a bond in the sum of five		
8	thousand dollars (\$5,000), and each of the deputy inspectors shall furnish a		
9	bond in the sum of two thousand dollars (\$2,000) conditioned upon the		
10	faithful performance of their duties and upon a true account of all moneys		
11	handled by them respectively and the payment thereof to the proper recipient		
12	(2) The bonds shall be approved by the Attorney General and		
13	deposited with the Secretary of State.		
14	(d)(c) The chief inspector, technical assistant, deputy boiler		
15	inspectors, chief clerk, secretary, bookkeeper, and stenographers shall		
16	constitute the division. The salaries of the chief inspector, technical		
17	assistant, deputy inspectors, chief clerk, secretary, bookkeeper, and		
18	stenographers employees of the Boiler Inspection Division, together with the		
19	necessary expenses of the division, shall be paid out of the fees for which		
20	provision is made in this chapter.		
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22	SECTION 3. Arkansas Code § 20-23-203(a), pertaining to boiler		
23	inspections, is amended to read as follows:		
24	(a) The Chief Inspector of the Boiler Inspection Division, either		
25	personally or by $\frac{1}{2}$ deputy inspector, shall carefully:		
26	(1) inspect Inspect internally and externally one (1) time		
27	annually every $\underline{\text{high pressure steam}}$ boiler and steam generating apparatus.		
28	(2) Inspect externally one (1) time annually and internally one		
29	(1) time every three (3) years every low pressure steam heating boiler to th		
30	extent permitted by the design and construction of the boiler;		
31	(3) The chief inspector or his deputy shall also inspect Inspect		
32	one (1) time biennially every unfired pressure vessel located in this state		
33	which is not excepted from the inspections by the provisions of this chapter;		
34	and		
35	(4) shall give Give the owner or operator of the boiler notice		
36	of the time when the an internal inspection will be made.		

2 SECTION 4. Arkansas Code § 20-23-301(a), pertaining to boiler and 3 pressure vessel permits, is amended to read as follows:

- (a)(1) No owner or user of a boiler <u>or pressure vessel</u> or engineer or fireman in charge of <u>it a boiler or pressure vessel</u> shall operate or allow <u>it the boiler or pressure vessel</u> to be operated without a certificate of inspection issued by the Director of the Department of Labor or shall allow a greater pressure in <u>it the boiler or pressure vessel</u> than is allowed by the certificate of inspection.
- (2)(A) All boilers <u>and pressure vessels</u> installed or in operation in this state shall conform to those regulations and standards that shall from time to time be adopted by the Boiler Inspection Division with the approval of the director.
- (B) The regulations and standards shall not exceed those set out in the several sections of the Boiler Code of the American Society of Mechanical Engineers and shall have the force of law immediately upon their approval by the director.
- (3) No person shall operate or cause to be operated any boiler or unfired pressure vessel on which the certificate of inspection has been suspended or the operation of which has been forbidden by an inspector as provided in §§ 20-23-203, 20-23-306, 20-23-310, 20-23-401, and 20-23-402.
- (4) All pressure piping installed in this state shall conform to those regulations and standards that shall from time to time be adopted by the division with the approval of the director. The regulations and standards shall not exceed those set out in the American Society of Mechanical Engineers Code for Pressure Piping, Power Piping Code, B31.1.

- SECTION 5. Arkansas Code § 20-23-402(a), pertaining to inspections by insurance companies, is amended to read as follows:
- 30 (a) Boiler inspectors employed by insurance companies which are 31 authorized to insure boilers in this state shall hold certificates of 32 competency issued by the Boiler Inspection Division as provided in this 33 section and shall:
- 34 <u>(1)</u> <u>inspect Inspect</u> internally and externally at least once 35 annually all <u>high pressure steam</u> boilers insured by their respective 36 companies;

1	(2) inspect externally one (1) time annually and internally one		
2	(1) time every three (3) years every low pressure steam heating boiler		
3	insured by their respective companies; and		
4	(3) except that Inspect unfired pressure vessels shall be so		
5	inspected biennially.		
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
