## For An Act To Be Entitled

AN ACT TO ALLOW SCHOOLS TO BEGIN EACH SCHOOL YEAR ON THE FIRST MONDAY FOLLOWING THE SECOND SATURDAY IN AUGUST; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

## Subtitle

AN ACT TO ALLOW SCHOOLS TO BEGIN EACH SCHOOL YEAR ON THE FIRST MONDAY FOLLOWING THE SECOND SATURDAY IN AUGUST.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 6-10-106 is amended to read as follows:
6-10-106. Uniform dates for beginning and end of school year.
(a)(1)(A) In each school year, the first day of the school year for student attendance in the public elementary and secondary schools of the State of Arkansas shall may begin no earlier than August 19 and the first Monday following the second Saturday in August, but shall begin no later than August 26. If, however, August 18 falls on a Monday, school may begin on that date. The date for beginning the school year shall be determined by the school board of the school district.
(B) Labor Day shall be celebrated as a school holiday in all the school districts of the state, and school shall not be held on that date.
(2) The Department of Education may grant a school district a
waiver to begin school on an earlier or later date if the department determines that there exists a material and substantial reason for the school district to begin on an earlier or later date due to very exceptional or emergency circumstances such as a contagious disease outbreak, inclement weather, or other acts of God.
(b) Contracts of employment for certified and noncertified employees of school districts may require school district employees to begin performance under their contract of employment prior to the first day of student attendance.
(c) If the school year in any school district extends beyond the date observed as Memorial Day, such date shall be a holiday in the district. Provided, upon approval of the department, this date may be used as a make-up day in any school district which has unavoidably lost more than five (5) scheduled days of student attendance during the course of the school year due to contagious disease outbreaks, inclement weather, or other acts of God.
(d) No other waiver from the requirements of this section shall be granted.
