filled for the unexpired term by an appointment made in the same manner as the original appointment.

- 4 SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 6-1-303 is amended to read as follows:
- 5 6-1-303. Duties.
- 6 (a) The Arkansas Commission for Coordination of Educational Efforts
- 7 shall study and recommend policies related to the improvement of coordination
- 8 among and between the levels of education from pre-kindergarten to the
- 9 graduate level.
- 10 (b)(1) The commission shall give priority to improvements benefiting
- 11 students at all levels of education in Arkansas.
- 12 (2) The commission shall work to benefit the State of Arkansas
- 13 and improve the economy of the state by recommending a more efficient system
- 14 of education.
- 15 (c) The commission shall:
- 16 (1) Recommend policies on concurrent enrollment of high school
- 17 students in college courses;
- 18 (2) Make recommendations related to a common calendar for all
- 19 public schools and institutions of higher education;
- 20 (3) Study the various delivery systems of distance learning and
- 21 recommend ways to improve and make more efficient a delivery system for
- 22 Arkansas;
- 23 (4) Recommend ways that the public schools, the Department of
- 24 Education, the Department of Higher Education, and the institutions of higher
- 25 education can improve working relationships in order to improve the
- 26 effectiveness of teaching for the public schools;
- 27 (5)(A) Recommend ways of improving the transfer of credit from
- 28 institution to institution for the benefit of the student.
- 29 (B) The transfer of credit includes recommendations for
- 30 improving the transfer from two-year institutions to four-year institutions
- 31 as well as the transfer among two-year institutions and four-year
- 32 institutions:
- 33 (6) Make recommendations related to aligning the curriculum from
- 34 kindergarten through the bachelor's level in colleges and universities;

15	SECTION 3. Arkansas Code § 6-11-124 is amended to read as follows:			
16	6-11-124. Statewide computer network.			
17	(a) Acts 1991, No. 1034, authorizes the Board of Trustees of the			
18	Arkansas Teacher Retirement System to provide a loan to the Department of			
19	Education for a statewide computer system capable of linking all public			
20	school systems and the department. In order to provide alternatives to			
21	accomplish the purposes of Acts 1991, No. 1034, the department is hereby			
22	authorized to enter into a contractual agreement with IMPAC Learning Systems,			
23	Inc. for the development of a statewide computer system capable of linking			
24	all public school systems and the department from funds provided by a loan			
25	from the system.			
26	(b) The State Board of Education shall maintain oversight authority			
27	over the approval of all standards, procedures, and specifications determined			
28	by the department regarding the purchase or lease of the statewide computer			
29	network in addition to maintaining oversight authority over the operational			
30	aspects of the system.			
31	$(c)(1)(\Lambda)$ As a means of providing assistance to, and coordination of			
32	efforts between the department, the Department of Information Systems, users			
33	of the statewide computer network, and other educational technology			
34	applications, there is hereby created the Public Education Technology			
35	Advisory Board, which shall consist of nine (9) members as follows:			
36	(i) The President of the Arkansas Science and			

1	iechnology Authority;
2	(ii) The Director of the Department of Information
3	Systems;
4	(iii) The Director of the Department of Education;
5	(iv) Three (3) citizens of the State of Arkansas who
6	are knowledgeable in the various aspects of educational finance who shall be
7	appointed by the Governor from a list of names submitted by the Arkansas
8	Association of Educational Administrators. They shall serve three year terms;
9	and and
10	(v) Three (3) members appointed by the Governor from
11	a list of names submitted by the association who are knowledgeable in the
12	various aspects of the student and instruction application. They shall serve
13	three-year terms.
14	(B) The members of the board shall serve without pay and
15	shall represent the needs and interests of citizens and users of educational
16	technology.
17	(C) The president shall be designated as chairman of the
18	board.
19	(D) The board shall be convened at the call of the chair.
20	(E) The Department of Education and the Department of
21	Information Systems shall provide appropriate staff support.
22	(2)(A) The board may create such advisory committees as it deems
23	necessary to assist it in carrying out its functions. The memberships of
24	these advisory committees may include members of the board and other persons
25	drawn from various sources, all of whom shall serve at the pleasure of the
26	board.
27	(B) Members of the advisory committees shall serve without
28	compensation for their membership on the committees.
29	(3) The board shall issue an annual report on the condition of
30	${\color{red} \textbf{educational technology in } \Lambda \textbf{rkansas to the Governor, the Joint Committee on}}$
31	Advanced Communications and Information Technology, and the Joint Interim
32	Oversight Subcommittee on Educational Reform.
33	$\frac{(d)(c)}{(d)}$ The director is hereby authorized to request from the Chief
34	Fiscal Officer of the State a transfer of appropriation authorized for school
35	district management and statewide data collection by the General Assembly to
36	any other line item appropriation authorized for the department for the same

1	purpose.

3	SECTION 4. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the			
4	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that there needs to be better			
5	coordination among educational entities in the state; that it is imperative			
6	to include science, mathematics, and technology interests in the coordination			
7	efforts; and that this act is immediately necessary because the Arkansas			
8	Commission for Coordination of Educational Efforts is in the process of			
9	developing recommendations for improvements in education in the state.			
10	Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and this act being immediately			
11	necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall			
12	become effective on:			
13	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;			
14	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,			
15	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the			
16	bill; or			
17	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is			
18	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
