22 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
23

24 SECTION 1. The purpose of this act is to amend, repeal, and add
25 policies, programs, regulations, and laws concerning insurance policies,
26 insurance premium taxes, other taxes, and other insurance related matters for
27 the purpose of providing for other necessary state programs and funding.
28

29 SECTION 2. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the
30 General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that policies, programs,
31 regulations, and laws concerning insurance policies, insurance premium taxes,
32 and other insurance related matters are imperative for the proper operation
33 of state government; that such changes need to be effective prior to the
34 beginning of the fiscal year to afford affected parties the opportunity to
35 adjust to the changes; and that this act is immediately necessary because the
36 next fiscal year begins July 1, 2005. Therefore, an emergency is declared to



1 exist, and this act being immediately necessary for the preservation of the
2 public peace, health, and safety shall become effective on:

3 (1) The date of its approval by the Governor;

4 (2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,
5 the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the
6 bill; or

7 (3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is
8 overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
