22	SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 6-11-102 is amended to read as follows:			
23	6-11-102. Director of the Department of Education.			
24	(a) Subject to confirmation by the Governor, the State Board of			
25	Education is empowered to employ a person to act as the <del>Director of the</del>			
26	Department of Education Commissioner of Education, who shall serve at the			
27	pleasure of the Governor in the best educational interests of the children of			
28	the State of Arkansas.			
29	(b) The <del>director</del> <u>Commissioner of Education</u> shall devote all of his or			
30	her time to the duties of his or her office, shall act as an agent of the			
31	board, and perform other duties as are designated by the board and by			
32	statute.			
33	(c)(l) The person selected as the <u>director</u> <u>Commissioner of Education</u>			
34	or any person serving as an interim commissioner must:

Division of Public School Accountability. 28 (a)(1) To enhance the public's access to public school performance 29 indicators and to better measure the benefits of the increasing public 30 investment in Arkansas' schools, the General Assembly finds that a Division 31 of Public School Accountability should be established under the direct 32 operational control of the State Board of Education Commissioner of 33 Education. 34 (2) The foremost obligation of the division shall be to administer all monitoring and compliance activities dealing with academic and 35 36 fiscal accountability for each school or school district and to report

1 academic progress.

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2 (b) There is created the Division of Public School Accountability, 3 which shall begin operation within one hundred twenty (120) ninety (90) 4 calendar days following June 3, 2004 July 1, 2004.

5 (c) The division shall be under the supervision of the state board 6 Commissioner of Education.

7 (d)(1) The state board Commissioner of Education shall select an 8 individual to serve as the Director of the Division of Public School 9 Accountability, and the director shall serve at the pleasure of the state 10 board.
