14	SECTION 2. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the		
15	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that exclusion of persons who are		
16	registered sex offenders or are required to register as a sex offender from		
17	certain employment or licensure is necessary for the protection of children,		
18	elderly, and developmentally disabled persons of the State of Arkansas; that		
19	this act will allow the disqualification of registered sex offenders or		
20	persons required to register as a sex offender from certain employment or		
21	licensure; and that this act is immediately necessary in order to allow state		
22	agencies and other entities to disqualify a registered sex offender or person		
23	required to register as a sex offender from licensing or employment.
