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20	SECTION 1. Effective January 1, 2007, Arkansas Code § 23-2-101 is

23	(a)(1) The Arkansas Public Service Commission shall consist of three		e
24	(3) five (5) members to be known as commissioners, one (1) of whom shall be a		ре а
25	lawyer.		
26	(2) Each commissioner sh	all have :	
27	<u>(A) Have</u> resided i	n the state for five (5) years; and	
28	shall be		
29	<u>(B) Be</u> a qualified	elector <u>;</u>	
30	<u>(C) Have resided i</u>	n his or her congressional district f	for
31	at least one (1) year before his or h	er appointment unless he or she was	
32	appointed to be the at-large member;		
33	(D) Not have been	an employee, officer, or director of	<u>a</u>
34	public utility, a subsidiary of a public utility, or the same entity that		
35	owns or controls the public utility w	ithin the four-year period before his	s or
36	her appointment: and		

1	(E) Not be a member of the General Assembly or have been		
2	member of the General Assembly within the four-year period before his or her		
3	appointment.		
4	(b) Each commissioner before entering on his or her duties shall take		
5	the oath prescribed by the Constitution, shall swear that he or she is not		
6	pecuniarily interested in any public utility or affiliate, or any public		
7	carrier or affiliate therewith, as employee, stockholder, or security holder.		
8	(c) Each commissioner shall execute a bond to the State of Arkansas in		
9	the sum of ten thousand dollars ($\$10,000$), conditioned for the faithful		
10	discharge and performance of his or her duties.		
11	(d) Each commissioner shall receive an annual salary of five thousand		
12	dollars (\$5,000), payable semimonthly or monthly in conformity with		
13	prevailing practices of other officers of the state.		
14	(e)(1) At the expiration of each of the commissioner's terms, the		
15	Governor, subject to the approval of the Senate, shall appoint one (1) member		
16	who shall hold office for a term of six (6) years. As soon as reasonably		
17	practicable and subject to the approval of the Senate, the Governor shall		
18	make the appointments to the commission in a manner that assures:		
19	(A) At least one (1) member shall be a resident of each		
20	congressional district, as those districts existed on January 1, 2005; and		
21	(B) The remaining member shall be a member at-large.		
22	(2)(A) Each commissioner shall hold office during the term for		
23	which he or she was appointed and until his or her successor is appointed and		
24	qualified.		
25	(B) Except for the initial four-year term of one (1) of		
26	the new commissioners created under subdivision (a)(1) of this section and		
27	designated by the Governor, each commissioner's term of office shall be six		
28	(6) years.		
29	(3) If a vacancy occurs when the General Assembly is not in		
30	regular session, the Governor shall appoint a successor who shall hold office		
31	until he or she or another appointee for the vacancy has been approved by the		
32	Senate.		
33	(f) The Governor shall designate one (1) of the commissioners as		
34	chair.

           The concurrence of two (2) three (3) members of the Arkansas Public
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     Service Commission shall be necessary for commission action.
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
