22 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

24 SECTION 1. Arkansas Code Title 6, Chapter 80, Subchapter 1 is amended
25 to add an additional section to read as follows:

26 6-80-106. Limitations of fee waiver and scholarships.

27 (a) For purpose of this section:

28 (1)(A) "Academic scholarships" means scholarships awarded on the
29 basis of criteria including entrance exam scores, high school grade point
30 averages, rank in high school graduating class, or scholarships awarded for
31 merit or academic performance.

32 (B) "Academic scholarships" does not include:

33 (i) Graduate assistantships or fellowships;

34 (ii) Tuition waivers based on age, military service,
35 or occupation;

36 (iii) Out-of-state tuition waivers for graduate



1 students or students from contiguous states in close proximity to a college
2 or university; and

3 (iv) Scholarships for transfers from two-year
4 institutions; and

5 (2) "Performance scholarships" means scholarships for band,
6 musical performing groups, arts, theater, forensics, and similar activities
7 that are not awarded on the basis of entrance exam scores or high school
8 academic achievement.

9 (b) Beginning with the 2005-2006 fiscal year and in subsequent years,
10 each college and university shall limit its unrestricted educational and
11 general expenditures for tuition waivers, tuition discounts, academic
12 scholarships, and performance scholarships to eight percent (8%) of its
13 educational and general tuition and fee income.
