28	(a) The purpose of this subchapte	er is to serve as a legislative

33	(b) It is the intent of the Gener	ral Assembly that the Arkansas

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6-18-403. Definitions. 2 As used in this subchapter: 3 "American College Test assessment" means a test of student 4 educational development that measures student readiness for future learning 5 produced by ACT, Incorporated, that may be used by an institution of higher 6 education as a part of its admissions process; (2) "American College Test Fee Waiver Program" means the 7 8 assessment fee waiver program established and administered by ACT, 9 Incorporated; "Board" means the State Board of Education; 10 11 (4) "Department" means the Department of Education; 12 (5) "Director" means the Director of the Department of 13 Education; and 14 "Program" means the Arkansas American College Test 15 Assessment Assistance Pilot Program. 16 17 6-18-404. Creation - Fees - Rules. (a)(1) The Arkansas American College Test Assessment Assistance Pilot 18 19 Program is hereby established, to be administered by the Director of the Department of Education. 20 21 (2) Each academic year, the Department of Education shall 22 gradually increase the number of pilot locations allowed to participate in 23 the program until all or substantially all All school districts in the state 24 with students in grades eleven (11) and twelve (12) are allowed to shall 25 participate in the program. 26 (b)(1) Contingent upon legislative appropriations, the state will pay 27 all or part of the American College Test assessment registration fee. 28 (2) The State Board of Education shall create a sliding scale based on family income. 29 30 The board is authorized to promulgate rules and regulations necessary to implement this subchapter, including the criteria for waiving 31 32 the American College Test assessment fee. 33 34 6-18-405. Participation. 35 Every public high school student in the pilot locations who is enrolled 36 in the core curriculum established pursuant to § 6-61-217 or Smart Core as

- 8 (a) Public high school counselors shall request a waiver of the
- 9 American College Test assessment fee for any student for whom a waiver would
- 10 be appropriate based on the guidelines for waivers set forth by ACT,
- 11 Incorporated.
- 12 (b) Public high school counselors shall report to the Department of
- 13 Education the number of students taking the American College Test assessment
- 14 during his or her junior year.

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- 16 6-18-407. Fee waiver eligibility Review committee.
- 17 (a) The American College Test assessment fee may be waived or paid by
- 18 the state, or the school district if a student can demonstrate that the
- 19 payment of the fee would cause a financial hardship upon the student or his
- 20 or her family.
- 21 (b) To qualify for the waiver, the student and the student's parents,
- 22 guardians, or persons in loco parentis shall petition the public high school
- 23 principal in writing prior to the start of the spring semester of the
- 24 student's junior year.
- 25 (c) Upon receipt of the request for waiver of the fee, the principal
- 26 shall establish a committee composed of the following school personnel to
- 27 evaluate and accept or reject the request for a waiver:
- 28 (1) The high school principal;
- 29 (2) The high school counselor; and
- 30 (3) Two (2) high school teachers.
- 31 (d) The committee shall meet at least thirty (30) days prior to the
- 32 first administration of the American College Test assessment during the
- 33 spring semester to review the requests and shall issue a written notice of
- 34 the committee's recommendation to the student and the student's parents,
- 35 guardians, or persons in loco parentis.
- 36 (e) Upon receipt of notice of denial of the waiver request, the

1	student or the student's parents, guardians, or persons in loco parentis may	
2	petition the superintendent for a review of the denial.	
3	(f) The superintendent's written decision on the request for review	
4	shall be considered the final decision regarding the fee waiver request.	
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6	6-18-408. Donations and grants.	
7	(a) The awards granted under the provisions of this subchapter may be	
8	funded by donations, grants, or legislative appropriation.	
9	(b) All donations, grants, and appropriations received shall be	
10	accounted for by the Department of Education.	
11	(c) The Director of the Department of Education may solicit and	
12	receive donations and grants for the purpose of making awards funding	
13	Arkansas American College Test Assessment Assistance Program.	
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
