At least one (1) of the appointees shall have a strong interest in 3 and commitment to economic and workforce development. At least one (1) of the 4 appointees shall have experience in the knowledge-based technology field. 5 (2) No more than four (4) members of the board shall be 6 appointed from any one (1) congressional district as the districts exist at 7 the time of the appointment. 8 (3) No more than two (2) members of the board at any one (1) 9 time shall be graduates of an undergraduate program of any one (1) state 10 university or college. 11 (b) After the appointment of the initial board, the members to be 12 appointed from recent or current boards of two year and four year campuses 13 shall be appointed by the Governor from a list of names submitted by the 14 Presidents Council. 15 (c) Vacancies on the board shall be filled for the unexpired terms, 16 and the appointments shall be made in the same manner for the positions 17 vacated. (d)(1) The members of the board shall serve staggered terms of six (6) 18 19 years. The terms of two (2) members shall expire each year. 20 (2) The members may serve no more than two (2) terms. 21 (e) An intensive orientation program designed by the council shall be 22 mandatory for board members. 23 (f) The board shall annually elect from its membership a chair and other officers necessary to carry on its business. 24 25 (g)(1) The board shall meet at least one (1) time during each calendar 26 quarter and at other times upon the call of the chair or of any other four 27 (4) members. 28 (2) The board shall, at the times that it desires, meet on the 29 campuses of the respective institutions of higher learning in the state. 30 (h) Members of the board shall serve without compensation but may 31 receive expense reimbursement in accordance with § 25-16-901 et seq. 32 33 6-61-202. Powers and duties generally. 34 (a) In order to promote a coordinated system of higher education in 35 Arkansas and to assure an orderly and effective development of each of the 36 publicly supported institutions of higher education, the Arkansas Higher

1 Education Coordinating Board shall have the following powers and duties: 2 (1)(A) To receive within one (1) year of their appointment and each year thereafter a minimum of eight (8) clock hours of instruction and 3 4 training, to include higher education issues, policies, laws, and the duties 5 and responsibilities associated with the position of board member; 6 (B) The members of the boards of all publicly supported 7 institutions of higher education shall receive similar instruction and 8 training within one (1) year of their appointment or election and each year 9 thereafter, which shall be conducted by the individual institutions; 10 (2) Along with its director, to be responsible, within fiscal 11 and staff capabilities, for directing an integrated program for defining, 12 popularizing, and securing acceptance of the major goals and objectives of 13 higher education in Arkansas and for relating them to the state's various 14 problems; 15 (3) To request and receive any information from the publicly 16 supported institutions of higher education as the board deems necessary for 17 the performance of its duties; 18 (4) To promulgate and adopt uniform definitions and forms in 19 such matters as financial reporting, academic statistics, and resident status 20 of students for use in making financial recommendations and standard 21 enrollment data to be followed by the institutions of higher learning; 22 (5) To determine the need for and recommend to the Covernor and 23 the General Assembly the establishment and location of any new institutions 24 and to recommend, when appropriate, changes in the names of existing state-25 supported institutions of higher learning; 26 (6) To recommend the level of funding and the method of 27 distribution of state-supported scholarships and loan programs, and to seek 28 the cooperation of the state-supported institutions of higher learning to 29 develop policies to coordinate all student loan and scholarship programs, 30 including those federally financed; and 31 (7) To review all proposed bond issues to be made by any public 32 institution of higher learning and to advise the board of trustees of each of 33 the respective institutions as to the economic feasibility thereof, as set 34 forth in § 6-62-306. 35 (b) The board shall encourage the cooperation of private institutions 36 of higher learning in its efforts to plan more effectively for the

1	coordinated development of higher education in this state.
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3	6-61-203. Director and staff - Funds - Central office.
4	(a)(1)(A) The Arkansas Higher Education Coordinating Board shall
5	appoint a director through a search and selection process that includes
6	substantial input, review, and recommendation from the Presidents Council,
7	subject to confirmation by the Governor.
8	(B) The director shall serve at the pleasure of the
9	Covernor.
10	(2) The director shall serve as a member of the Governor's
11	cabinet as the advocate for higher education.
12	(3) The director shall be an experienced educator in the field
13	of higher education who demonstrates competence in the field of institutional
14	management and finance. The director and key staff must have relevant
15	experience on a campus of higher education.
16	(b) The professional qualifications and salary of the director and
17	other members of the staff employed by the board shall be comparable to those
18	in colleges and universities.
19	(c) The staff of the board shall be under the direction and
20	supervision of the director.
21	(d) The board shall be provided sufficient operating funds to enable
22	it to carry out adequately the programs and functions assigned to the
23	Department of Higher Education.
24	(e) The central office of the department shall be maintained in Little
25	Rock.
26	(f)(1) The board shall evaluate the director annually.
27	(2) The council shall provide an evaluation report of the
28	department and the director to the board at least annually.
29	
30	6-61-204. Advisory committees and councils.
31	(a) The Arkansas Higher Education Coordinating Board and the
32	Presidents Council are authorized to establish advisory committees and
33	councils as may be deemed necessary for the effective development and
34	coordination of higher education in this state.
35	(b)(1) The Presidents Council shall be composed of all
36	presidents and chancellars of public two year and four year colleges and

T	universities.
2	(2) The council shall meet at least quarterly.
3	(3) This council shall serve in a strong advisory capacity to
4	the director and to the board.
5	(4) All board items must be reviewed by this council prior to
6	being placed on the board's agenda.
7	(c)(1)(A) There is created the Executive Council, which shall be
8	selected by the Presidents Council from its membership.
9	(B) The Executive Council shall consist of four (4)
10	members from two-year campuses and four (4) members from four-year campuses.
11	(2) Executive Council members shall serve for staggered terms of
12	two (2) years.
13	(3) The Executive Council shall elect officers as it deems
14	necessary.
15	(4) The Executive Council shall meet at least monthly, or more
16	frequently as needed, with the director and senior staff.
17	(5)(A) All items to be considered as board agenda items must be
18	reviewed by the Executive Council before being placed on any board agenda.
19	(B) In the event that the director and staff shall not be
20	in agreement with the Executive Council on a matter to be considered by the
21	board, the Executive Council's recommendation will be placed on the board
22	agenda automatically for a presentation and explanation of the Executive
23	Council's position. The board will then make a decision based on both
24	positions.
25	$(d)(1)(\Lambda)$ A working committee structure shall be established involving
26	the Presidents Council or its designees.
27	(B) Examples of possible committees include but are not
28	limited to accountability, graduate studies, undergraduate studies, workforce
29	development, continuing education, and financial and funding.
30	(2) The committees shall make recommendations to the Presidents
31	Council and the director when policy or funding issues are to be decided.
32	(3) The department employees shall staff each committee.
33	
34	6-61-205. Master plan.
35	(a) In order to promote a coordinated system of higher education in
36	Arkansas and to assure an orderly and effective development of each of the

1 publicly supported institutions of higher education, the Arkansas Higher 2 Education Coordinating Board shall have the power and duty to accept 3 responsibility for continuous master planning. 4 (b) The board shall involve a broadly representative advisory 5 committee in the development of a comprehensive master plan for all of 6 postsecondary education and shall continually use the committee to keep the 7 master plan updated. 8 (c) This plan shall include all senior colleges and universities which 9 are state supported, community colleges, branches of state supported 10 institutions, independent or private colleges and universities, proprietary 11 institutions, and postsecondary efforts of area vocational-technical schools. 12 (d) Broad citizen participation shall be sought by the board in the 13 development of this plan. 14 15 6-61-206. Studies, surveys, evaluations, etc. 16 In order to promote a coordinated system of higher education in 17 Arkansas and to assure an orderly and effective development of each of the 18 publicly supported institutions of higher education, the Arkansas Higher 19 Education Coordinating Board shall have the power and duty: 20 (1) To conduct or cause to be made such studies, surveys, and 21 evaluations of postsecondary education as the board believes necessary to 22 carry out its duties, to include, but not be limited to, studies of space utilization and development of guidelines for space utilization; studies of 2.3 24 manpower needs and their implications for program development; studies of 25 programs for purposes of identifying and reducing unnecessary program 26 duplication and identifying needs for new programs; analysis of class size, faculty loads, and cost of instruction, sabbatical leave, and other fringe 27 28 benefits; analysis of enrollments, extension programs, sources of students, 29 and retention of students; and advise institutions of plans and needed 30 improvements. 31 (2) To conduct continuing studies as to public universities and 32 colleges in all matters affecting these institutions and from time to time 33 submit recommendations to the Governor, the General Assembly, and each 34 institution of higher learning based upon its findings, together with

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recommended plans for implementing such recommendations.

1 6-61-207. Role and scope designations. 2 (a) In order to promote a coordinated system of higher education in 3 Arkansas and to assure an orderly and effective development of each of the publicly supported institutions of higher education, the Arkansas Higher 4 5 Education Coordinating Board shall have the power and duty to establish, in 6 consultation with college and university personnel, appropriate role and 7 scope designations within which boards of trustees must operate the 8 institution or institutions under their jurisdiction. 9 (b) The board shall establish such role and scope designations 10 by January 1, 1990. The designations may be changed at any time as 11 determined by the board. They shall be fully reviewed at least once every 12 five (5) years. 13 (c) Prior to their establishment of or making changes in role and 14 scope designations, the board shall carefully study the change in 15 consultation with institutional personnel, announce the intent to consider a 16 change, and publicly reveal the change that is being proposed at a regular 17 quarterly meeting, with the vote to come no sooner than the next regular quarterly meeting. 18 19 20 6-61-208. New units of instruction, research, and public service. 21 (a)(1) In order to promote a coordinated system of higher education in 22 Arkansas and to assure an orderly and effective development of each of the 23 publicly supported institutions of higher education, the Arkansas Higher 24 Education Coordinating Board shall have the power and duty to request, receive, evaluate, and approve proposals for all new units of instruction, 25 26 research, and public service, consistent with established role and scope 27 designations which have been approved by the board of trustees and the 28 president of an institution, and to determine, based upon established 29 policies, whether new units of instruction, research, or public service are 30 iustified. 31 (2)(A) "Established policies" as used in this subsection means a 32 written statement developed by the board in consultation with and upon the 33 advice of representatives of each of the state's institutions of higher learning which shall set forth the relevant criteria which a proposal for a 34 35 new unit of instruction must meet before its establishment by an institution 36 is justified.

1	(B)(i) The term "new unit of instruction, research, or
2	public service" used in this subsection includes establishment of a college,
3	school, division, institute, center, department, new curricula, majors
4	leading to a new degree program, or an extension service not presently
5	included in the program of the institution.
6	(ii) The term does not include reasonable and
7	moderate extensions, as defined by the board, of existing curricular research
8	or public service programs which have a direct relationship to existing
9	programs at the several public institutions of higher learning.
10	(b) General revenues appropriated by the General Assembly shall not be
11	expended for new programs that have not been recommended by the board.
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13	6-61-209. Budgets.
14	In order to promote a coordinated system of higher education in
15	Arkansas and to assure an orderly and effective development of each of the
16	publicly supported institutions of higher education, the Arkansas Higher
17	Education Coordinating Board shall have the following powers and duties:
18	(1) To review, evaluate, and coordinate budget requests for the
19	state-supported universities and colleges and present to the General Assembly
20	and to the Governor prior to each regular session of the General Assembly a
21	single budget report containing the recommendations for separate
22	appropriations to each of the respective institutions.
23	(A) The recommendations will be consistent with a
24	comprehensive master plan of postsecondary education in Arkansas as developed
25	by the board.
26	(B) The recommendations, insofar as possible, will be
27	based upon standard techniques of objective measurement of need and unit cost
28	figures arrived at through comparative data secured from the several
29	institutions.
30	(C) Specific needs of institutions based upon existing
31	programs and deficiencies will be given consideration.
32	(2) To develop, in conjunction with the institutions of higher
33	learning, the Governor, and the Legislative Council, a single set of budget
34	forms which will be utilized by all parties in making requests and
35	recommendations for the funding of state-supported colleges and universities.
36	The forms and process will require that the total income and expenditures of

1	each institution must be considered in the request process.
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3	6-61-210. Allocation of additional state funds.
4	(a) The Arkansas Higher Education Coordinating Board is authorized and
5	directed to establish criteria and standards for the allocation of additional
6	state funds provided for such purposes to state-supported institutions of
7	higher learning experiencing enrollment increases greater than were
8	anticipated at the time the board prepared its budget recommendations for
9	allocations of funds to the respective institutions prior to each biennial
10	legislative session.
11	(b)(l) The criteria and standards shall be applicable to all
12	state-supported institutions of higher learning experiencing enrollment
13	growth.
14	(2) However, with respect to the State Medical Center, the board
15	shall develop criteria and standards for measuring and determining the
16	additional financial support required, within the limitation of funds
17	provided therefor, because of unusual factors which create additional
18	spending responsibilities of the State Medical Center.
19	(c) The criteria and standards developed by the board for allocating
20	additional financial support to state-supported institutions of higher
21	learning from moneys provided therefor shall be subject to review and
22	approval of the Governor, and the amount to be allocated to each institution
23	shall be upon certification and approval by the Governor.
24	
25	6-61-212. State agency for federal programs.
26	In order to promote a coordinated system of higher education in
27	Arkansas and to assure an orderly and effective development of each of the
28	publicly supported institutions of higher education, the Arkansas Higher
29	Education Coordinating Board shall have the power and duty to serve as the
30	state agency of this state for such federal programs which can most
31	appropriately be administered by it.
32	
33	6-61-213. Administration of trusts, endowments, etc.
34	(a) In order to promote a coordinated system of higher education in
35	Arkansas and to assure an orderly and effective development of each of the
36	publicly supported institutions of higher education, the Arkansas Higher

1 Education Coordinating Board shall have the power and duty to provide 2 administrative assistance in accordance with terms agreed upon by both the Department of Higher Education and parties establishing trusts, endowments, 3 4 or otherwise providing funds in support of scholarships, research, or other 5 educational activities at Arkansas institutions of higher education. 6 (b)(1) The department is not authorized to be the custodian of, or to in any way participate in, the financial management of trusts, 7 endowments, or other funds established for purposes of §§ 6-61-101 - 6-61-8 9 103, 6-61-201 - 6-61-209, 6-61-211 [repealed], 6-61-212 - 6-61-216, 6-61-301 -6-61-305, 6-61-306 [repealed], 6-61-401, 6-61-402, 6-61-501 -6-61-524, 6-61-501 -6-61-524, 6-61-501 -6-61 10 11 61-601 - 6-61-603, and 6-61-604 - 6-61-612 [repealed]. 12 (2) The assistance of the department is limited to 13 administrative support in the allocation or awarding of funds to be disbursed 14 by the donor or a properly authorized trustee. 15 (c) The department is authorized to supplement administrative costs 16 for such assistance by charging a minimal administrative fee acceptable to 17 the department and the parties establishing the endowments or providing the 18 funds. 19 20 6-61-214. Review of existing degree programs - Minimum standards. 21 (a) In order to promote a coordinated system of higher education in 22 Arkansas and to assure an orderly and effective development of each of the 23 publicly supported institutions of higher education, the Arkansas Higher 24 Education Coordinating Board shall have the power and duty to establish 25 minimum standards of quality and cost effectiveness, and review each existing 26 academic degree program in the state institutions of higher education at 27 least every ten (10) years, but no more frequently than every seven (7) 28 years. 29 (b) Such programs shall either be certified as having met 30 established standards or placed on two year probationary status. During the 31 probationary period, at the request of the institution, the board shall 32 provide guidance to the institutions in an attempt to qualify the programs to 33 meet the minimum standards for quality and cost effectiveness. 34 (c) At the end of the two-year period, the board shall make 35 recommendations to the institutions, the Covernor, and the General Assembly

concerning the continuation, or termination, or extended probation of the

program.

(d) General revenues shall not be expended for operation of degree programs beyond the deadline set by the board without the specific approval of the General Assembly. The deadline shall coincide with the end of the biennium.

6-61-215. Student fees.

In order to promote a coordinated system of higher education in Arkansas and to assure an orderly and effective development of each of the publicly supported institutions of higher education, the Arkansas Higher Education Coordinating Board shall have the power and duty to establish the level of student fees for funding purposes for both in-state and out-of-state students for all public institutions of higher learning in the state. The level of fees shall be determined after careful study of fees charged in other states in similar institutions.

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6-61-216. Transfer students.

- (a) In order to promote a coordinated system of higher education in Arkansas and to assure an orderly and effective development of each of the publicly supported institutions of higher education, the Arkansas Higher Education Coordinating Board shall have the power and duty to develop, with the assistance of institutional advisory committees, policies for transfer students from community colleges to senior institutions, for transfer of students among institutions of the same type, and for transfer of students from vocational and technical schools to other institutions.
- (b) These policies should be a part of the comprehensive master plan and should receive review from appropriate citizens throughout the state prior to adoption by the board for their recommendation to the boards of trustees of institutions.

6-61-217. Minimum core courses for college prep.

(a) In order to promote a coordinated system of higher education in Arkansas and to assure an orderly and effective development of each of the publicly supported institutions of higher education, the Arkansas Higher Education Coordinating Board, after consultation with the State Board of Education, shall identify a minimum core of high school courses recommended

1 for preparation for college. 2 (b) The board shall communicate this information at least 3 annually to public school superintendents, who shall make copies available 4 each year to public school students enrolled in grades seven through twelve 5 (7-12).6 (c) The board may revise the list of high school courses from time to 7 time, as needed. 8 9 6-61-218. Minimum college core - Transferability. 10 In order to promote a coordinated system of higher education in 11 Arkansas and to assure an orderly and effective development of each of the 12 publicly supported institutions of higher education, the Arkansas Higher 13 Education Coordinating Board shall establish in consultation with the colleges and universities a minimum core of courses which shall apply toward 14 15 the general education core curriculum requirements for baccalaureate degrees 16 at state supported institutions of higher education and which shall be fully 17 transferable between state institutions. 18 19 6-61-220. Retention and graduation rate information. 20 (a)(1) Accurate information about the retention and graduation rates 21 of students at state-supported colleges and universities is needed in order 22 for the Arkansas Higher Education Coordinating Board, institutional boards of 23 trustees, the General Assembly, and institutional faculty members and 24 administrators to make informed decisions related to the coordination, 25 governance, financing, and academic policies of higher education in Arkansas. 26 (2) Special attention to the retention and graduation rates of 27 students who participate in intercollegiate athletics is needed because the 28 percentage of student athletes who graduate is lower than for students who do 29 not participate in athletics at many institutions throughout the nation. 30 (b)(1)(A) The Department of Higher Education shall, in consultation 31 with the colleges and universities, recommend a system for the collection of 32 information as to the retention and graduation rates of students at state-33 supported colleges and universities to the board, the Governor, the House and 34 Senate Committees on Education, and the colleges and universities. 35 (B) In addition to retention and graduation rates for all 36 students, the report shall also include the retention and graduation rates of

1 all students who participate in intercollegiate athletics. 2 (2) Except as provided in subsection (c) of this section, officials of state colleges and universities shall provide the information 3 4 requested by the department to the department by December 1 of each year, 5 beginning in 2000. 6 (c)(1) Subject to an adequate appropriation for the personnel and 7 equipment necessary to implement the system recommended under subdivision 8 (b)(1) of this section, the department shall collect the information 9 described in subdivision (b)(1) of this section and report its findings to 10 the board, the Governor, the committees, and the colleges and universities by 11 May 1 of each year, beginning in 2000. 12 (2) Notwithstanding the provisions of subdivision (c)(1) of this 13 section, colleges and universities shall commence the collection of 14 information as to the retention and graduation rates of all students who 15 participate in intercollegiate athletics beginning in the fall semester of 16 1989 and shall report this information to the department by December 1 of 17 each year, beginning in 2000. 18 (d) The board is hereby authorized to promulgate rules and regulations 19 consistent with the intent and purpose of this section. 20 2.1 6-61-221. Reporting of graduates requiring postsecondary remediation. 2.2 (a)(1) The Department of Higher Education shall have the authority to collect from the public institutions of higher education in the state such 23 24 information as may be necessary to prepare reports of college achievement of 25 high school graduates. 26 (2) The department shall have the authority to contract with 27 appropriate organizations for the preparation of the reports, contingent upon 2.8 the availability of funds. 29 (b)(1) The department and the Office of Accountability of the 30 Department of Education shall work together to develop a compatible system of 31 reporting the number of students who required remediation during their first 32 year of enrollment in a public institution of higher education in this state 33 if the enrollment occurred within two (2) years of graduation from a 34 secondary school in this state. 35 (2) The public school districts shall work with the department

and the office to develop a compatible system of reporting the number of

1	students requiring remediation who graduated with a 3.0 or higher grade point
2	average on a 4.0 scale and who graduated from a program of the minimum core
3	of high school courses recommended for preparation for postsecondary
4	education by the Arkansas Higher Education Coordinating Board and the State
5	Board of Education pursuant to § 6-61-217.
6	(c) The compilation report generated by the department shall not
7	include individual student information if the information is reported in a
8	manner which would identify a particular student. Any information gathered
9	which identifies a particular student shall be confidential.
10	(d)(1) The Department of Higher Education shall provide the reports to
11	the Department of Education and the Department of Workforce Education and may
12	also provide the reports to the coordinating board, the Governor, the House
13	and Senate Committees on Education, and the state board.
14	(2) The reports developed pursuant to this section shall be
15	provided to each public high school and to school district administrators by
16	the Department of Education.
17	
18	6-61-222. Uniform reporting standards.
19	(a)(1) The Arkansas Higher Education Coordinating Board is authorized
20	and directed to establish uniform reporting standards to report biennially
21	all current funds' revenues and expenditures associated with each academic
22	department and, within each department, with the academic programs offered at
23	each state-supported institution of higher education.
24	(2) Such reports shall be subject to biennial review by the
25	board and House Interim Committee on Education and the Senate Interim
26	Committee on Education.
27	(3) The reports shall be predicated on the following
28	definitions:
29	(A) "Academic department" means each organizational and
30	budgetary unit associated with the delivery of instruction, research, and
31	public service activities;
32	(B) "Academic program" means any program of study leading
33	to a degree or certificate and any other program as defined by the Department
34	of Higher Education;
35	(C) "Academic department and program revenues" shall
36	include tuition and fees, both undergraduate and graduate, endowments, gifts
