19 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

21 SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 19-4-609 is amended to read as follows:

22 19-4-609. Productivity reporting.

23 (a) Each state agency, other than the elected constitutional officers,
24 shall institute and maintain a program to increase the productivity and cost
25 effectiveness of the employees for which they are responsible.

26 (b)(1) Each executive, judicial, legislative, and any other agency of
27 the *state, and each institution of higher education* shall provide, on a
28 calendar-monthly basis, information reflecting the number of current
29 employees in each such agency, the number of newly hired employees, the
30 number of employees who have transferred to other state agencies, the number
31 of employees who retired, the number of all other separations of employees,
32 the number of current vacant budgeted positions, and such other information
33 as may be requested.

34 (2) Each executive, judicial, legislative, and any other agency
35 of the state, and each institution of higher education shall provide, on a
36 quarterly basis, a statement of the reasons for any vacant budgeted



1 positions.

2 ~~(2)~~(3) The information shall be compiled on forms developed by
3 the Bureau of Legislative Research and submitted to the Legislative Council
4 on a calendar-quarterly basis.
