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19	SECTION 1. Arkansas	Code § 6-13-1603(f) through	gh (1), concerning
20	administrative reorganization, are amended to read as follows:		
21	(f) No school facility in a school district included in the		
22	consolidation list required by § 6-13-1602 shall be closed by the state board		
23	or a local school board until after completion of an assessment of public		
24	school facilities by the Joint Committee on Educational Facilities as		
25	required by Act 1181 of 2003, but in no event shall any be closed prior to		
26	June 1, 2005.		
27	(g) (f) No administra	atively consolidated or an	nexed school district
28	shall have more than one (1) superintendent.		
29	(h)(g) No school district administratively consolidated with a school		
30	district designated by the state board as being in academic or fiscal		
31	distress shall be subject to academic or fiscal distress sanctions for a		
32	period of three (3) years from the effective date of consolidation unless:		
33	(1) The school district fails to meet minimum teacher salary		
34	requirements; or		
35		(2) The school district fails to comply with the Standards for

- 1 (i)(h) Noncontiguous school districts may voluntarily consolidate if 2 the facilities and physical plant of each school district:
- 3 (1) Are within the same county, and the state board approves the 4 administrative consolidation; or
- 5 (2) Are not within the same county, and the state board approves 6 the administrative consolidation or annexation and finds that:
- 7 (A) The consolidation or annexation will result in the 8 overall improvement in the educational benefit to students in all of the 9 school districts involved; or
- 10 (B) The consolidation or annexation will provide a
 11 significant advantage in transportation costs or service to all of the school
 12 districts involved.
- 13 (j)(i) Contiguous districts may administratively consolidate even if 14 they are not in the same county.
- 15 (k)(j) The state board shall promulgate rules to facilitate the administration of this subchapter.
- 17 (1)(k) The provisions of § 6-13-1406 shall govern the board of
 18 directors of each resulting or receiving school district created under this
 19 subchapter.

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- 21 SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 6-20-602 is amended to read as follows: 22 6-20-602. Isolated schools.
 - (a) "Isolated school" means a school within a school district that:
- 24 (1) Prior to administrative consolidation or annexation under 25 this section, § 6-13-1601 et seq., and § 6-13-1405(a)(5) qualified as an 26 isolated school district under § 6-20-601; and
- 27 (2) Is subject to administrative consolidation or annexation 28 under this section, § 6-13-1601 et seq., and § 6-13-1405(a)(5).
- 29 (b) Any isolated school within a resulting or receiving district shall 30 remain open <u>unless:</u>
- 31 (1) The resulting school district has a three-quarter average 32 daily membership of less than twelve hundred (1200) students;
- 33 (2) The isolated school has a three-quarter average daily
 34 membership of less than two hundred eighty (280) students in the 2003-3004
 35 school year; and
- 36 <u>(3) An the school district receives less than five hundred</u>

dollars (\$500) per student for isolated funding under §6-20-603. (c) Funding for isolated school districts shall be expended by the resulting or receiving district only on the operation, maintenance, and other expenses of the isolated schools within the resulting or receiving district if the isolated school remains open.
