BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 23-13-101 is repealed.
23-13-101. Hours of duty and rest period of drivers - Penalties Exceptions.
(a) It shall be unlawful for any companies, firms, or corporations, or officers of courts or individuals owning, operating, leasing, or subleasing any lines using vehicles propelled by any form of energy on the highways of Arkansas for the purpose of transporting passengers, freight, mail, express, or any commodity to keep their drivers on duty more than fifteen (15) consecutive hours. At the expiration of fifteen (15) hours of duty, the driver must have at least eight (8) hours of rest.
(b) Any companies, firms, corporations, lessees or sublessees, of individuals violating any of the provisions of this section shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction shall be fined not less than fifty dollars ( $\$ 50.00$ ) nor more than five hundred dollars ( $\$ 500$ ). Each vehicle illegally operated as provided in this section shall constitute a separate offense.
