28	SECTION 1. Arka	ansas Code Title 6, Chapter 18, Subch	napter 7 is amended
29	to add new sections to read as follows:		
30	6-18-707. Preso	cription inhalers.	
31	(a)(1) Each school district shall develop a procedure to allow		
32	students to carry and use inhalers while in school or at a school-sponsored		
33	activity if the inhaler is prescribed by a licensed individual with		
34	prescriptive privileges.		
35	(2) Students who need to carry inhalers shall provide the school		
36	with medical documentation that the inhaler has been legitimately prescribed		

1	and that the student needs to carry it on his or her person due to a medical
2	condition.
3	(3) No student shall be disciplined solely for failure to
4	provide medical documentation with regard to an inhaler in advance.
5	(b) No school district, school district employee, or agent of a school
6	district shall be liable for injury to a student caused by his or her use of
7	a prescription inhaler, except for injury caused by acts or omissions of the
8	school district's employees or agents that constitute gross negligence or
9	willful and wanton misconduct.

11	6-18-708. Medication.
12	(a) Each school district shall develop a procedure to allow students
13	$\underline{\text{to self-carry}}$ and self-administer a one-day supply of medication, including \underline{a}
14	controlled substance, during an off-site school-sponsored activity.
15	(b)(1) A student's medication shall be supplied by the student's
16	parent or guardian with the written authorization of the student's parent or
17	$\underline{\text{guardian for use of the medication during off-site school-sponsored activity.}}$
18	(2) The student's medication shall be stored and transported in
19	its original prescription-labeled container in the case of a prescription
20	medication or its manufacturer-labeled container in the case of
21	nonprescription medication.
22	(3) In the case of a prescription medication, the student's
23	parent or guardian shall provide a copy of the prescription written by \underline{a}
24	licensed individual with prescriptive privilegeS, if the prescription is not
25	already on file in the school.
26	(c) A student is prohibited from sharing, transferring, or in any way
27	diverting his or her own medications to any other person.
28	(d) No school district, school district employee, or agent of a school
29	district shall be liable for injury to a student caused by his or her self-
30	administration of medication, except for injury caused by acts or omissions
31	$\underline{\text{of the school district's employees or agents that constitute gross negligence}}$
32	or willful and wanton misconduct.
