28	WHEREAS, the Nat	ional Guard and Reserve military forces have	respon	ded		
29	to every major nationa	l security threat in the history of the Unite	d Stat	es,		
30	from the Revolutionary	War and War of 1812, World War I, World War	II, th	e		
31	Korean War, the Vietna	m War, and Operation Desert Storm to, most re	cently	,		
32	Operation Iraqi Freedom, not to mention numerous peacekeeping, security, and

35	WHEREAS, the Nat	ional Guard and Reserves account for only a f	ractio	n of		
36	the defense budget, bu	t allow the nation to almost double the size	of the			



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1 Armed Forces, making them an essential part of a total-force concept; and 2 3 WHEREAS, the National Guard and Reserves are vital to the national 4 security of the United States; and 5 6 WHEREAS, since the terrorist attacks of September 11, 2001, the 7 operational commitments of the United States Armed Forces, including the 8 National Guard and Reserves, have increased significantly; and 9 10 WHEREAS, currently three thousand two hundred fifty (3,250) Arkansas 11 National Guard soldiers and airmen are serving on federal active duty; and 12 13 WHEREAS, responding to the needs of their country has required 14 significant sacrifices on the part of the members of the National Guard and 15 Reserves and their families; and 16 17 WHEREAS, members of the Arkansas National Guard and Reserves come from all walks of life and often leave their jobs as teachers, emergency medical 18 19 technicians, police officers, firefighters, doctors, nurses, social workers, plumbers, lawyers, accountants, auditors, and other occupations and 20 21 professions to serve their country; and 22 23 WHEREAS, many occupations and professions are regulated by a board, 24 commission, or other entity, such as the Supreme Court, which licenses 25 lawyers; and 26 27 WHEREAS, many occupations and professions that are regulated have 28 annual continuing education requirements, in-service requirements, minimum 29 annual duty requirements, annual fees, and other requirements or fees; and 30 31 WHEREAS, members of the Arkansas National Guard and Reserves may have a 32 difficult, if not impossible, time fulfilling the requirements or paying the 33 fees to maintain their professional and occupational licenses while serving 34 on federal active duty, 35 36

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NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE EIGHTY FIFTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS, THE SENATE CONCURRING
THEREIN:

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5 THAT the Eighty-fifth General Assembly of the State of Arkansas 6 encourages each and every state agency, board, or commission that regulates 7 occupations and professions to extend leniency to license holders, 8 certificate holders, and registrants who are activated members of the 9 Arkansas National Guard and Reserves, the leniency to include a grace period 10 for continuing education requirements, in-service requirements, minimum 11 annual duty requirements, and fees.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Eighty-fifth General Assembly of the Assembly of the Arkansas encourages each and every entity that regulates occupations and professions to provide a minimum grace period for activated members of the Arkansas National Guard and Reserves of active duty plus twelve (12) months.

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BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that upon adoption of this resolution, the clerk of the House of Representatives shall mail a copy of this resolution to the following state agencies, boards, and commissions that regulate occupations and professions in the State of Arkansas:
