TO RECOGNIZE INTERNET SAFETY AWARENESS DAY.

WHEREAS, the Internet has become today's information superhighway; and

WHEREAS, the exploration and use of the Internet for learning and communications has become an ordinary part of the work and recreation of all Arkansans; and

WHEREAS, young people are increasingly at risk from adult predators who use the Internet for solicitation and other harmful reasons; and

WHEREAS, there is a need to increase the awareness of all Arkansans about the risks of predatory conduct on the Internet; and

WHEREAS, the Attorney General of Arkansas has developed the "Keys to Safety" program to educate young people about online safety and teach them about other protective measures; and

WHEREAS, a local Arkansan, Jillian Bridges, has made the promotion of public awareness of the dangers of surfing the Internet a part of her platform as Miss Teen Arkansas Valley; and

WHEREAS, the General Assembly also wants to encourage public awareness and education about risks associated with Internet use,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE EIGHTY-FIFTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS, THE SENATE CONCURRING THEREIN:
