WHEREAS, it is important for the citizens of the State of Arkansas to have confidence in the integrity of all branches of government; and

WHEREAS, attorneys at law are involved in all branches of government and particularly the judicial department; and

WHEREAS, the practices of unethical attorneys negatively impact the public's perception of the integrity of the judicial department; and

WHEREAS, the Arkansas Supreme Court regulates the practice of law and the professional conduct of attorneys at law in accordance with the Arkansas Constitution, Amendment 28,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE EIGHTY-FIFTH general assembly of the state of arkansas, the senate concurring therein:

That the Arkansas General Assembly urges the Arkansas Supreme Court to
revise the Procedures Regulating Professional Conduct of Attorneys at Law to:
(1) Clarify that imposition of sanctions under Rule 11 of the Arkansas Rules of Civil Procedure constitutes grounds for discipline; and
(2) Require the Supreme Court Committee on Professional Conduct to file an action for disbarment against any attorney at law who has been sanctioned under Rule 11 of the Arkansas Rules of Civil Procedure on three (3) separate occasions and the imposition of the sanctions has been affirmed throughout the appeal process.
