8	HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION
9	COMMENDING TAIWAN FOR ITS CLOSE ECONOMIC AND
10	BUSINESS TIES WITH THE STATE OF ARKANSAS AND
11	CALLING FOR NEGOTIATIONS TOWARD A FREE TRADE
12	AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE UNITED STATES AND TAIWAN.

15	COMMENDING TAIWAN FOR ITS CLOSE ECONOMIC
16	AND BUSINESS TIES WITH THE STATE OF
17	ARKANSAS AND CALLING FOR NEGOTIATIONS
18	TOWARD A FREE TRADE AGREEMENT BETWEEN
19	THE UNITED STATES AND TAIWAN.

22	WHEREAS, the State of Arkansas has a strong and vibrant economic
23	relationship with Taiwan; and in 2003, Arkansas exported more than seventy-
24	eight million dollars (\$78,000,000) worth of goods to Taiwan including
25	chemicals, food and related products, animal products, aluminum, petroleum
26	products, paper products, computer products, electronic products,
27	agricultural products, wood products, electrical components, and machinery;
28	and
29	
30	WHEREAS, according to Arkansas official statistics for 2003, Arkansas'
31	exports grew by thirty-seven percent (37%) compared to 2002, placing Arkansas
32	with the third largest percentage of increase of any state in the nation for
33	2003 for trade with Taiwan; and
34	
35	WHEREAS, in 2003, the two-way trade between the United States and
36	Taiwan reached more than forty-nine billion dollars (\$49,000,000,000): the

1	United States became the second largest exporter to Taiwan; and Taiwan became
2	the sixth most important destination of United States agriculture exports;
3	and
4	
5	WHEREAS, Taiwan's private business investments in Arkansas, mainly in
6	the petrochemical industry, have assisted in creating numerous job
7	opportunities in Arkansas; and
8	
9	WHEREAS, Taiwan has begun to send several important and varied cultural
10	performing groups to Arkansas, affording Arkansans the opportunity to have
11	interaction with these groups, enjoy the entertainment, and broaden their
12	cultural horizons; and
13	
14	WHEREAS, in the future, Arkansas will have the opportunity to send
15	youth to Taiwan to participate in cultural, educational, and economic
16	exchange programs with the possibility of rejuvenating the commercial,
17	investment, and tourism opportunities between Arkansas and Taiwan; and
18	
19	WHEREAS, in 2002, the United States International Trade Commission
20	concluded that a free trade agreement between the United States and Taiwan
21	would benefit United States farmers, manufacturers, and the economy as a
22	whole; and the United States Chamber of Commerce agreed that it is important
23	to recognize Taiwan's vibrant economy and that the United States has an
24	interest in a free trade agreement with Taiwan; and
25	
26	WHEREAS, in 2003, more than seventy (70) members of the United States
27	Congress, including Representatives Marion Berry and Mike Ross, supported
28	HCR98 in the 108th Congress; and
29	
30	WHEREAS, negotiations of a free trade agreement between the United
31	States and Taiwan should help to preserve and enhance the Arkansas share of
32	Taiwan's market, and concurrently this would increase exports of Arkansas
33	agriculture directly and indirectly to other markets throughout Asia; and a
34	free trade agreement would combine the powerful strengths of the United
35	States' innovation and market prowess with Taiwan's famed know-how and
36	unparalleled market flexibility; and

2	WHEREAS, the House of Representatives commends Taiwan for its close
3	economic and business ties with the State of Arkansas, encourages the United
4	States to increase trade opportunities with Taiwan, and calls for
5	negotiations toward a free trade agreement between the United States and
6	Taiwan,

8	NOW THEREFORE,
9	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE EIGHTY-FIFTH GENERAL
10	ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS, THE SENATE CONCURRING THEREIN:
11	
12	THAT the House of Representatives commends Taiwan for its close
13	economic and business ties with the State of Arkansas, encourages the United
14	States to increase trade opportunities with Taiwan, and calls for
15	negotiations toward a free trade agreement between the United States and
16	Taiwan.
