16	PROPOSING AN AMENDMENT TO SECTION 14 OF
17	ARTICLE 19 OF THE ARKANSAS CONSTITUTION
18	TO AUTHORIZE THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY TO

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22	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE EIGHTY-FIFTH GENERAL
23	ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS AND BY THE SENATE, A MAJORITY OF ALL
24	MEMBERS ELECTED TO EACH HOUSE AGREEING THERETO:
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26	That the following is proposed as an amendment to the Constitution of
27	the State of Arkansas, and upon being submitted to the electors of the state
28	for approval or rejection at the next general election for Senators and
29	Representatives, if a majority of the electors voting thereon at the
30	election, adopt the amendment, the amendment shall become a part of the
31	Constitution of the State of Arkansas, to wit:
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33	SECTION 1. Section 14 of Article 19 of the Arkansas Constitution is
34	amended to read as follows:
35	§ 14. Lotteries prohibited .
36	No lottery shall be authorized by this State, nor shall the sale of

1	lottery tickets be allowed.
2	(a) Except as specifically provided in this section, all lotteries and
3	the sale of lottery tickets are prohibited.
4	(b)(1) The General Assembly may by law define lottery and provide for
5	the operation and regulation of a lottery or lotteries by or on behalf of the
6	state, and for any matters relating to the purposes or provisions of this
7	section.
8	(2) Proceeds derived from the lottery or lotteries operated by
9	or on behalf of the state shall be deposited into financial institutions
10	other than the State Treasury and used to pay the operating expenses of the
11	lottery or lotteries, including all prizes, without any appropriation
12	required by law, and all remaining proceeds shall be deposited into the State
13	Treasury to supplement, not supplant, appropriations provided by the General
14	Assembly for public school facilities for grades kindergarten through twelve
15	<u>(K-12).</u>
16	(3)(A) The remaining proceeds after payment of the operating
17	expenses of the lottery, including prizes, shall be separately accounted for
18	and together with any interest accumulated on the funds transferred
19	immediately to the State Treasury for deposit into the Public Schools
20	Facilities Trust Fund.
21	(B) The General Assembly may only appropriate funds from
22	the Public School Facilities Trust Fund for purposes relating to the
23	construction, renovation, purchase, or maintenance of public school
24	facilities for grades kindergarten through twelve (K-12).
25	(C) For the purpose of this section, "the construction,
26	renovation, purchase, or maintenance" means such expenses related to the
27	construction, renovation, purchase, or maintenance of public school
28	facilities for grades kindergarten through twelve (K-12) as may be defined by
29	a law.
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31	SECTION 2. This amendment becomes effective on January 1, 2007.
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
