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30	THAT the following is proposed as an amendment to the Constitution of
31	the State of Arkansas, and upon being submitted to the electors of the state

34	adopt the amendment, the amendment shall become a part of the Constitution of

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1 SECTION 1. Section 5 of Article 5 of the Constitution of the State of 2 Arkansas is amended to read as follows: 3 § 5. Time of meeting. 4 The General Assembly shall meet in regular session at the seat of 5 government every two years, on the first Tuesday after the second Monday in 6 November, until said time be altered each year at such time as provided by 7 law. 8 9 SECTION 2. Section 17 of Article 5 of the Constitution of the State of 10 Arkansas is amended to read as follows: 11 § 17. Duration of sessions. 12 The regular biennial sessions, shall not exceed sixty days in duration, unless by a vote of two-thirds of the members elected to each house of said 13 General Assembly. Provided, that this section shall not apply to the first 14 15 session of the General Assembly under this Constitution, or when impeachments 16 are pending. 17 18 SECTION 3. Section 29 of Article 5 of the Constitution of the State of 19 Arkansas is amended to read as follows: 20 § 29. Appropriations. 21 (a)(1) No money shall be drawn from the treasury except in pursuance 22 of specific appropriation made by law, the purpose of which shall be 23 distinctly stated in the bill, and the maximum amount which may be drawn 24 shall be specified in dollars and cents; and no appropriations shall be for a 25 longer period than two years. 26 (2) An appropriation bill enacted in a regular session of the 27 General Assembly in an even-numbered year shall not extend beyond the 28 biennial period in which the bill is enacted. 29 (b) As used in this constitution, "biennial period" means July 1 of an 30 odd-numbered year through June 30 of the next odd numbered year. 31 32 SECTION 4. Section 31 of Article 5 of the Constitution of the State of 33 Arkansas is repealed. 34 § 31. Purposes of taxes and appropriations. 35 No State tax shall be allowed, or appropriation of money made, except

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to raise means for the payment of the just debts of the State, for defraying

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     invasion and suppress insurrection, except by a majority of two-thirds of

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           SECTION 5. Section 39 of Article 5 of the Constitution of the State of
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     Arkansas is repealed.
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           [$ 39.] State expenses - Limitation - Exceptions.
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           § 3. Excepting monies raised or collected for educational purposes,
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     highway purposes, to pay Confederate pensions and the just debts of the
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     State, the General Assembly is hereby prohibited from appropriating or
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     expending more than the sum of Two and One-Half Million Dollars for all
     purposes, for any biennial period; provided the limit herein fixed may be
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     exceeded by the votes of three-fourths of the members elected to each House

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           SECTION 6. Section 40 of Article 5 of the Constitution of the State of
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     Arkansas is amended to read as follows:
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           [§ 40.] General appropriation bill - Enactment.
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           § 4. (a) In making appropriations for any biennial period, the General
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     Assembly shall first pass the General Appropriation Bill provided for in
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     Section 30 of Article 5 of the Constitution, and no other appropriation bill
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     may be enacted before that shall have been done. [As added to Art. 5 by
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     Const. Amend. 19.]
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           (b)(1) If the General Appropriation Bill enacted during a regular
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     session held in an odd-numbered year is effective for both fiscal years of
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     the biennial period, then in the regular session held in an even-numbered
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     year, the General Assembly is not required to enact a General Appropriation
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     Bill before other appropriation bills may be enacted for the second year of
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     the biennial period.
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                 (2) If the General Appropriation Bill enacted during a regular
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     session held in an odd-numbered year is effective only for the first fiscal
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     year of the biennial period, then during a regular session held in the
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     subsequent even-numbered year, the General Appropriation Bill for the second
     year of the biennial period shall be enacted before any other appropriation
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     bill may be enacted.

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1	SECTION 7. Section 7 of Amendment 35 to the Constitution of the State
2	of Arkansas is amended to read as follows:
3	§ 7. Executive secretary and other personnel - Selection - Salaries and
4	expenditures.
5	The Commission shall elect an Executive Secretary, whose salary shall
6	not exceed that of limitations placed on other constitutional departments;
7	and other executive officers, supervisor supervisors, personnel, office
8	assistants, wardens, game refuge keepers, and hatchery employees, whose
9	salaries and expenditures must be submitted to the Legislature and approved
10	by an Act covering specific items in the ${\color{red}\text{biennial}}$ appropriation ${\color{red}\text{as}}$ covered by
11	Article XVI Section 4 of the Constitution.
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13	SECTION 8. This amendment becomes effective on January 1, 2007.
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
