20	WHEREAS, Mr. Clark McClinton of Fayetteville, Arkansas, died on	
21	Saturday, July 10, 2004, at the age of ninety-one (91) years; and	
22		
23	WHEREAS, Mr. McClinton was born on May 25, 1913, in Fayetteville,	
24	Arkansas; and	
25		
26	WHEREAS, Mr. McClinton graduated from University High School in	
27	Fayetteville, Arkansas, in 1930 as valedictorian of his class; founded	
28	McClinton Brothers with his older brother, Charles, in 1947; and served as	
29	Chairman of the National Limestone Institute and Chairman of the Arkansas	
30	chapter of the Associated General Contractors; and	
31		
32	WHEREAS, Mr. McClinton was active in civic affairs; served on the	
33	Fayetteville School Board, the State Board of Education, the City Hospital	
34	Development Council, and the University of Arkansas Development Council; was	
35	a lifetime member of the Northwest Arkansas Advisory Board of the Salvation	
36	Army; was a founding member of the Arkansas Methodist Foundation; was a	



1 founding member of the Northwest Arkansas Council; and was a founding member 2 of the Fayetteville Community Foundation; and 3 WHEREAS, Mr. McClinton was involved in politics; served as Chairman of 4 5 the Washington County Democratic Party's Central Committee; was a member of 6 the Fayetteville Downtown Rotary Club, and for the nearly fifty (50) years 7 that he was a member, he had perfect attendance; was a Paul Harris Fellow; 8 and was a past president and Rotary District Governor; and 9 10 WHEREAS, Mr. McClinton was instrumental in founding the Bank of 11 Fayetteville and served on the advisory board from its inception; and 12 WHEREAS, Mr. McClinton was a faithful member of Wiggins Methodist 13 14 Church since 1945 and served in many capacities and remained active until his 15 death; and 16 17 WHEREAS, Mr. McClinton played a role in changing the course of history in Fayetteville, Arkansas, and in the South; he was on the 1954 Fayetteville 18 19 School Board that voted to integrate the high school; and he seconded the original integration motion at a 1954 school board meeting; and 20 21 22 WHEREAS, Fayetteville, Arkansas, was the first school district south of 23 the Mason-Dixon Line to be integrated after the United States Supreme Court 24 ruled that racial segregation in public education was discriminatory; and 25 26 WHEREAS, Mr. McClinton is survived by his son and daughter-in-law, 27 David McClinton and Imelda; his grandchildren, Michelle Wisdom and her 28 husband John, Kenneth McClinton and his wife Beth, Amy Driver and her husband 29 Mike, and Christopher McClinton; his six (6) great-grandchildren, Alexandra 30 Holcroft, Luke Wisdom, Samuel McClinton, Isaac McClinton, David Driver, and Jack Dawson Driver; and several nieces and nephews; and 31 32 33 WHEREAS, the House of Representatives of the Eighty-fifth General 34 Assembly wishes to publicly recognize Mr. McClinton's many contributions to 35 the State of Arkansas and his local community, 36
