20	WHEREAS, demographic changes and cost increases will drain the existing
21	Social Security system; and
22	
23	WHEREAS, without significant changes to the system, costs will exceed
24	revenues starting in 2018 and the Social Security Trust Fund will be
25	completely exhausted by 2042; and
26	
27	WHEREAS, not reforming the system will require a fifty percent (50%)
28	tax increase on every working American or a thirty percent (30%) benefit cut;
29	and

31	WHEREAS, social security provides a below market average rate of return
32	of one and one-half percent (1.5%) which further contributes to the system's
33	financing problems; and

35	WHEREAS, allowing younger workers to divert a portion of their payroll
36	taxes into personal retirement accounts will ensure a higher retirement

benefit without the need to raise taxes or cut benefits, or both; and WHEREAS, allowing younger workers to divert a portion of their payroll taxes into personal retirement accounts will eventually eliminate the ten trillion dollars (\$10,000,000,000) in unfunded social security liabilities, NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE EIGHTY-FIFTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS: THAT the Members of the House of Representatives of the Eighty-Fifth General Assembly request that the elected Representatives and Senators in the United State Congress from the State of Arkansas support no increases in payroll taxes, no cuts to social security benefits, and optional social security personal retirement accounts. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT copies of this resolution be transmitted to the Congressional Delegation of the State of Arkansas by the Clerk of the House of Representatives.
