TO RECOGNIZE THE FIFTIETH ANNIVERSARY OF THE "HOXIE 21".

## Subtitle

TO RECOGNIZE THE FIFTIETH ANNIVERSARY OF THE HOXIE 21.

WHEREAS, the United States Supreme Court's landmark ruling in Brown v Board of Education in 1954 outlawed segregation in the public schools and, as a result, the Hoxie School board voted to allow twenty-one (2l) local black students to attend Hoxie schools rather than the local black elementary school and a high school some twenty-five (25) miles away; and

WHEREAS, making such a change would require courage and commitment on the part of many, including school officials and community leaders, and such traits also extended on a more personal level to the black students and their families; and

WHEREAS, the "Hoxie 21" and their families faced the situation with a calm dignity and grace with a commitment to education and with a respect for the rule of law and, together and with the community's help, they withstood threats to their lives and their livelihoods; and

WHEREAS, the "Hoxie 21" came from the following families: Barksdale, Braxton, Brown, Henderson, Hill, Kelly, Riley, Ruffin, and Tompkins, NOW THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE EIGHTY-FIFTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

That the House of Representatives of the Eighty-fifth General Assembly of the State of Arkansas takes great pride in recognizing the "Hoxie 21" and their families for their commitment and courage during very difficult and turbulent times.
