18	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:	
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20	SECTION 1. Arkansas Code Title 20, Chapter 27, is amended to add ar	ı
21	additional subchapter to read as follows:	
22	20-27-1701. Legislative findings and purpose.	
23	(a) The General Assembly finds that:	
24	(1) The unexpected death of infants and children is an import	ant
25	public health concern;	
26	(2) The collection of data on the causes of unexpected deaths	<u>3</u>
27	will enable the State of Arkansas to protect some infants and children from	<u>om</u>
28	preventable deaths and help reduce the incidence of these deaths; and	
29	(3) Multi-disciplinary and multi-agency review of infant and	
30	child deaths can assist this state in investigating infant and child death	ıs,
31	developing a greater understanding of the incidence and causes of these	
32	deaths and the methods for prevention and identifying the gaps in services	s to
33	children and families.	
34	(b) The purpose of this subchapter is to:	
35	(1) Identify the causes of death of children under eighteen (	(18)
36	years of age; and	

1	(2) Reduce the incidence of injury and death to children by
2	requiring a death review to be performed in all cases of unexpected deaths of
3	children under eighteen (18) years of age.
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5	20-27-1702. Definitions.
6	As used in this subchapter:
7	(1) "Child" means a person under eighteen (18) years of age; and
8	(2) "Unexpected death" means:
9	(A) A death involving a child who has not been in the care
10	of a licensed physician for treatment of an illness that is the cause of
11	death; or
12	(B) A clinical diagnosis of death due to Sudden Infant
13	Death Syndrome.
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15	20-27-1703. Arkansas Child Death Review Panel - Creation.
16	(a) The Arkansas Child Death Review Panel is created within the
17	Arkansas Child Abuse/Rape/Domestic Violence Commission.
18	(b) The review panel shall consist of a minimum of seven (7) members
19	as follows:
20	(1) A representative from the State Medical Examiner's Office;
21	(2) A coroner representing the county where the death being
22	reviewed occurred;
23	(3) A representative from the Center for Health Statistics of
24	the Department of Health;
25	(4) A representative from the Crimes Against Children Division
26	of the Department of Arkansas State Police;
27	(5) A representative from the Division of Children and Family
28	Services of the Department of Human Services;
29	(6) A representative from the Arkansas Child Abuse/Rape/Domestic
30	<u>Violence Commission;</u>
31	(7) A physician who specializes in child abuse; and
32	(8) Any other representative the review panel determines is
33	necessary for a review.
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35	20-27-1704. Duties.
36	The Arkansas Child Death Review Panel may:

1	(1) Establish local and regional review panels and delegate some
2	or all of its responsibilities under this subchapter;
3	(2) Analyze data available from state agencies or other agencies
4	that may decrease unexpected deaths of children;
5	(3) Collect, review, and analyze all death investigation reports
6	prepared under this subchapter and other appropriate information to prepare
7	reports for the General Assembly concerning the causes of unexpected deaths
8	of children and methods to decrease those deaths;
9	(4) Identify trends relevant to unexpected deaths of children;
10	(5) Educate the citizens of Arkansas regarding the incidence and
11	causes of injury to and death of children and of the public's role to assist
12	in reducing this risk;
13	(6) Establish training criteria for county coroners; and
14	(7) Determine the information to be included in a child death
15	investigation report and provide this information to county coroners, medical
16	providers, and other agencies to be used in preparing a death investigation
17	report.
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19	<u>20-27-1705.</u> Investigation.
20	(a)(1) A copy of a child death investigation report required under
21	this subchapter, including information from law enforcement agencies,
22	coroners, fire departments, medical providers, or any other information
23	relative to the death investigation shall be provided to the Arkansas Child
24	Death Review Panel within thirty (30) days from the date the review panel
25	requests the information.
26	(2) Subdivision (a)(1) of this section is not applicable to a
27	death that is under criminal investigation or prosecution.
28	(b)(1) The review panel or a local or regional review panel may access
29	medical records and vital records in the custody of physicians, hospitals,
30	clinics, other health care providers, and the Department of Health concerning
31	the unexpected death of the child being investigated.
32	(2) The review panel may request any other information,
33	documents, or records pertaining to the completed investigation of unexpected
34	deaths of children.
35	(c) Nothing in this subchapter shall alter or restrict the authority
36	or jurisdiction of a county coroner.

1	(d) When the review panel determines that a parent or guardian was
2	treating a child according to the tenets and practices of a recognized
3	religious method of treatment that has a reasonable proven record of success,
4	the review panel is not required to make a finding of negligent treatment or
5	maltreatment.
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7	20-27-1706. Records - Confidentiality.
8	(a)(1) All records, reports, and other information obtained by the
9	Arkansas Child Death Review Panel or local or regional review panel and the
10	result of any child death investigation report shall be confidential.
11	(2) The records, reports, and other information obtained by the
12	review panel or local or regional review panel shall not be:
13	(A) Subject to a subpoena;
14	(B) Disclosed or compelled to be produced in any civil,
15	administrative, or other proceeding; or
16	(C) Admissible as evidence in any civil, administrative,
17	or other proceeding.
18	(3) The records, reports, and other information obtained by the
19	review panel or local or regional review panel shall be available to law
20	enforcement agencies and prosecuting attorneys.
21	(b) Any person, agency, or entity furnishing confidential information
22	shall not be liable for releasing the confidential information if the
23	information was furnished in good faith under the provisions of this
24	subchapter.
25	(c) The review panel may publish statistical compilations reflecting
26	unexpected deaths of children that do not identify individual cases,
27	physicians, hospitals, clinics, or other health care providers.
28	(d)(1) State, local, or regional review panel members shall be immune
29	from civil and criminal liability in connection with their good faith
30	participation on the review panel and all activities related to the review
31	panel.
32	(2) No civil or criminal immunity exists if a state, local, or
33	regional review panel member knowingly or willingly violates this subchapter.
34	(e) Pursuant to the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability
35	Act of 1996, disclosure of protected health information is allowed for public
36	health, safety, and law enforcement purposes and providing case information

1	on unexpected deaths of children for review by the review panel is not a
2	violation of that act.
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4	20-27-1707. Reporting.
5	(a)(1) The Arkansas Child Death Review Panel shall report on or before
6	December 31 of each year to the Legislative Council the number and causes of
7	unexpected deaths of children.
8	(2) The Legislative Council shall forward the report to the
9	Senate Interim Committee on Children and Youth and the House Interim
10	Committee on Aging, Children and Youth, Legislative and Military Affairs.
11	(b) The report shall include:
12	(1) The review panel's finding and recommendations for each of
13	its duties under § 20-27-1704;
14	(2) An analysis of factual information obtained from the review
15	of the child death investigation reports under § 20-27-1705; and
16	(3) Reports of the review panel and any local or regional review
17	panels that do not violate the confidentiality provisions under § 20-27-1706.
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
