36	(I) "Average daily	membership" means th	e total number of days	

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1	attended plus the total number of days absent by students in grades
2	kindergarten through twelve (K-12) during the first three (3) quarters of
3	each school year divided by the number of school days actually taught in the
4	district during that period of time rounded up to the nearest hundredth.
5	Students who may be counted for average daily membership are:
6	(A) Students who reside within the boundaries of the
7	school district and who are enrolled in a public school operated by the
8	district or a private school for special education students with their
9	attendance resulting from a written tuition agreement approved by the
10	Department of Education;
11	(B) Legally transferred students living outside the
12	district but attending a public school in the district; and
13	(C) Students who reside within the boundaries of the
14	school district and who are enrolled in the Arkansas National Guard Youth
15	Challenge Program, so long as the students are participants in the program;
16	(2) "Local revenue" means in each school year ninety-eight
17	percent (98%) of the amount of revenue available, whether or not collected,
18	in a local school district solely from the levy of the uniform rate of tax
19	plus seventy-five percent (75%) of the average miscellaneous funds collected
20	in the previous five (5) years or the previous year, whichever is less;
21	(3) "Mandatory callable bonds" means a bond issue in which all
22	net proceeds from debt service millage used to secure the issuance of that
23	bond must be applied to payment of the issue and may not be used for any
24	other purpose;
25	(4) "Miscellaneous funds" means those funds received by a local
26	school district from federal forest reserves, federal grazing rights, federal
27	mineral rights, federal impact aid, federal flood control, wildlife refuge
28	funds, severance taxes, funds received by the district in lieu of taxes, and
29	local sales and use taxes dedicated to education pursuant to §§ 26-74-201 et
30	seq., 26-74-301 et seq., 26-75-301 et seq., and 14-164-301 et seq.;
31	(5) "School district assessment per student" means the total
32	assessed valuation of property within a school district divided by the school
33	district's average daily membership;
34	(6) "State assessment per student" means the total assessed
35	valuation of property within the state divided by the statewide average daily
36	membership;

1	(7) "State wealth index" means the result of one (1) minus the		
2	ratio of local revenue for a school year divided by the amount of state funds		
3	allocated to the school district from the Public School Fund for unrestricted		
4	general support of the school district;		
5	(8) "Statewide average daily membership" means the total number		
6	of days attended plus the total number of days absent by all students in		
7	grades kindergarten through twelve (K-12) in all school districts during the		
8	first three (3) quarters of each school year divided by the number of school		
9	days actually taught during that period of time rounded up to the nearest		
10	hundredth. Students who may be counted for average daily membership are:		
11	(A) Students who reside in Arkansas and who are enrolled		
12	in a public school operated by a school district or a private school for		
13	special education students, with their attendance resulting from a written		
14	tuition agreement approved by the Department of Education; and		
15	(B) Students who reside in Arkansas and who are enrolled		
16	in the Arkansas National Guard Youth Challenge Program, so long as the

18	(9) "Supplemental millage incentive funding" means state funding		
19	paid to school districts that levy ad valorem taxes in excess of the twenty-		
20	five (25) mills required by Arkansas Constitution, Amendment 74; and		
21	(10) "Supplemental millage incentive funding base" means the		
22	assessment per student at the ninety-fifth percentile of the state assessment		
23	per student less the school district assessment per student multiplied by one		
24	one-thousandth (.001).

26	6-20-2504. Supplemental millage incentive funding.		
27	(a) Beginning with school year 2005-2006, the State of Arkansas shall		
28	provide from available line item funds supplemental state funds to qualified		
29	school districts that increase total school district maintenance and		
30	operation millage in excess of the twenty-five (25) mills required under		
31	Arkansas Constitution, Amendment 74.		
32	(b) For each school year beginning with school year 2005-2006, the		
33	Department of Education shall determine by July 15 immediately preceding the		
34	school year:		
35	(1) The total maintenance and operation millage rate of ad		
36	valorem tax levied in each school district as of December 31 immediately		

1	preceding the school year; and
2	(2) The number of mills, if any, by which the total maintenance
3	and operation millage rate exceeds the twenty-five (25) mills required by
4	Arkansas Constitution, Amendment 74.
5	(c)(l) A school district's supplemental millage incentive funding
6	shall be equal to the result of multiplying the lesser of the number five (5)
7	or the result of subdivision (b)(2) of this section by the school district's
8	supplemental millage incentive funding base multiplied by the school
9	district's average daily membership.
10	(2) The supplemental millage incentive funding base shall be
11	computed based upon property values as of the December 31 immediately
12	preceding the school year and the average daily membership for the previous
13	school year.
14	(d) Supplemental millage incentive funding shall be distributed
15	quarterly.

17	SECTION 2. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the
18	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that school districts in the state
19	operate on a fiscal-year basis beginning on July 1 of each year; that the
20	effectiveness of this act on July 1, 2005, is essential to the effective
21	operation of the school districts of the state; and that in the event of an
22	extension of the regular session, the delay in the effective date of this act
23	beyond July 1, 2005, could work irreparable harm upon the proper
24	administration and provision of essential educational programs. Therefore,
25	an emergency is declared to exist and this act being immediately necessary
26	for the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall become
27	effective on July 1, 2005.
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
