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21	SECTION 2. (a) The purpose of the Task Force on Mental Health		
22	Treatment Services is to assess statewide delivery and funding of mental		
23	health treatment services.		
24	(b) The task force will strive to achieve the following:		
25	(1) Assess state mental health treatment needs and evaluate the		
26	current service delivery system and its capacity to respond to those current		
27	and projected treatment needs;		
28	(2) Examine state interagency referral trends and continuity of		
29	care to include the identification of service duplication and service		
30	overlap;		
31	(3) Determine accurate statewide service costs and identify more		
32	cost effective means for the delivery of mental health treatment services an		
33	the identification of available revenue streams, underutilized revenue, and		
34	uncaptured revenue;		
35	(4) Carry out a cost-benefit analysis of mental health treatmen		
36	services to include outcome benefits for the development of policy and		

1	procedure reform; and		
2	(5) Make recommendations for the strategic development and		
3	implementation of efficient and effective quality care measures.		
4	(c)(1) The findings and recommendations of the task force shall be		
5	submitted to the legislative leaders, state department directors, state		
6	providers, and other appropriate parties for collaborative reform.		
7	(2)(A) The task force shall report to the Legislative Council,		
8	the Senate Interim Committee on Public Health, Welfare, and Labor, and the		
9	House Interim Committee on Public Health, Welfare, and Labor.		
10	(B) The report shall be submitted no later than October 1		
11	of each even numbered year.		
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
