33	SECTION 2. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the		
34	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that on-call medical specialists		
35	required to be on call for twenty-four (24) hours per day to a human		
36	development center are not considered employees for purposes of becoming a		

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1	member of the Arkansas Public Employees' Retirement System; that due to the
2	nature of their employment they should be allowed to become members of the
3	system; and that for the effective administration of this act it should
4	become effective immediately. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist
5	and this act being necessary for the preservation of the public peace,
6	health, and safety shall become effective on:
7	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;
8	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,
9	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the
10	bill; or
11	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is
12	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
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
