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21 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
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23 SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 17-95-704(a), concerning treatment of
24 chronic intractable pain, is amended to read as follows:

25 (a)(1) A physician shall not be subject to disciplinary action by the
26 Arkansas State Medical Board solely for prescribing dangerous or controlled
27 drugs for the relief of chronic intractable pain.

28 (2)(A) Any allegation of improper prescribing determined to
29 require a board hearing shall be referred to the Pain Management Review
30 Committee before any board hearing or action.

31 (B) The board shall provide the Pain Management Review
32 Committee all necessary documentation for the review process in a timely
33 manner.

34 ~~(2)(3)~~ (3) The board shall direct the Pain Management Review
35 Committee to use the criteria under subsections (d) and (e) of this section
36 to review a physician's conduct in regard to prescribing, administering,



1 ordering, or dispensing pain medications and other drugs necessary to treat
2 chronic intractable pain.

3 (4)(A) If the board determines that an allegation or a question
4 regarding a physician's prescribing does not justify a board hearing, in lieu
5 of a board hearing, the board may refer a physician to the Pain Review
6 Committee for review and recommendations to the board.

7 (B) The review and recommendations under subdivision
8 (a)(4)(A) of this section shall not adversely affect the physician's license
9 or licensure status.

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11 SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 17-95-705 is amended to read as follows:

12 17-95-705. Pain Management Review Committee - Membership - Duties.

13 (a)~~(1)~~ There is created the Pain Management Review Committee,
14 appointed by the Arkansas State Medical Board.

15 ~~(2) In lieu of a disciplinary hearing, the board may refer a~~
16 ~~physician to the committee for review and recommendations.~~

17 (b) The committee shall consist of five (5) members who are full-time
18 active physicians in direct patient care, two (2) of whom may be board-
19 certified pain management specialists and three (3) of whom may be physicians
20 with significant pain management in their practices or with a degree in
21 pharmacy, appointed by the board from a list provided by the Arkansas
22 Osteopathic Medical Association, the Arkansas Medical Society, and the
23 Arkansas Pain Society.

24 (c) The committee shall:

25 (1) ~~In cooperation with~~ Have committee representation from the
26 Arkansas Osteopathic Medical Association, the Arkansas Medical Society, and
27 the Arkansas Pain Society, to develop guidelines for investigations of
28 complaints regarding conduct in violation of this subchapter;

29 (2) Review complaints on an individual patient-needs basis
30 regarding physicians treating chronic intractable pain in violation of this
31 subchapter; and

32 (3) Provide an objective critique to the board for board
33 determination in a timely manner and if so determined, before the board's
34 disciplinary hearing.

35 (4) In order to ensure a fair, impartial, and objective board
36 hearing, no board member shall be:

1 (A) Present while the committee reviews allegations of
2 improper prescribing; or

3 (B) Involved in any way in the committee's deliberations.

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
